Mr. ... Upon receipt of such application and payment of the stamp, the collector will forward to the stamp agent at the establishment of the contractor, designated an order for the imprinting of the stamp, and the delivery of the stamped paper to the contractor for shipment to owner, taking the contractor's receipt for the same.

Tractable collectors in draw offices are on this stamp agent at the establishment of any contractor, a list of contractors in various cities, in numbers and names of the stamp agent at each establishment, will be furnished to the collector. The collector will debit himself with the stamp agent imprinted and credit himself with those so sold, deducting the amount received in his deposits on account of value of documents.

The sale of imprinted stamps must, however, be shown on the collector's monthly report of documentary and proprietary stamps. At each of the establishments where stamps are authorized to be imprinted upon drafts, orders, and papers, an authorized agent of the government will be stationed who will receive from collectors orders for the imprinting and delivery of imprinted stamps. The agent should carefully read the contract with this office so he may know in all the provisions thereof and see that they are fully complied with. He will also have authority to take such other precautionary measures as may be necessary to protect the interests of the government in the printing and salekeeping of imprinted stamps.

He will be required to keep an accurate and permanent record in a book provided for of all check stamps, postage due and of those delivered to the contractor. He will also keep a record in a book supplied therewith a debt and account with each order received from collectors for imprinting stamps, showing as to any orders received, the date when received, in whose favor drawn, the number of stamps delivered, and the amount due thereon, if any.

He will also make a blank form to be furnished with his monthly reports to the commissioners of internal revenue showing all transactions relating to the imprinting and delivery of imprinted stamps during the month.

The agent will transmit, with his monthly reports to the commissioner, all collectors' orders which have been filled by the printing of all the stamps authorized thereto.

Deliveries of stamps on any order should be endorsed theron by the agent, with the date of delivery. Where necessary, a counter will be employed to count the stamps and render other assistance to the agent, so counter to be subject to the orders of the stamp agent.

New York, June 24.—A dispute in the World from San Fran. June 24, via San Antonio, Jan. 20, June 23, saw many men killed and eight wounded on the Texas today. The battle at the time of the landing of the troops went Matamoros to make a faint attack on the fortifications there in connection

with a land force of Cubans under Rabo. The Texas silenced the Beaupois battery. Just as the action ended a shell entered the battleship and exploded with the result given above.
