to go on the Isthmus with the other transports, which are to depart on Monday

The Astor light battery, two batteries of the third artillery and ten men of the hospital corps will go on the Newport.

Brigadier-General McArthur has formally assumed command of the third expedition, and the troops have been ordered to break camp early Monday morning.

While the departure of this expedition there will have been sent from San Francisco nearly 12,000 troops, leaving about 8,000 to go.

Orders have been issued for the immediate improvement of the sanitary conditions at Camp Merritt.

MUTILATION CHARGE WITHDRAWN

Washington, June 25.—In response to a telegram from the navy department requesting definite information concerning the alleged mutilation of the bodies of the four marines killed in an outpost at Guantánamo, Admiral Sampson has wired Secretary Long as follows:

"Plaza del Este, June 25.—Replying to your dispatch, I have to report that a careful investigation has been made, and it is reported to me that the apparent mutilation was probably due to the effect of the small-caliber bullets fired at short range and I withdraw the charge of mutilation."

ANOTHER EXPEDITION READY.

Washington, June 25.—An expedition of 6,000 men is expected to leave Tampa within the next three days. It comprises the command of Brigadier General Snyder, the third division of the first army corps.

The stores are already going aboard the transports and the start of the expedition may wait the arrival of a naval convoy. Part of the supplies sent over with Shafter's expedition have been released from Admiral Sampson and are now on their way back to Tampa to escort additional troops.

Simultaneously with this, General Hyatt's division will be moving along the Atlantic coast and thence to Santiago. In all the reinforcements from Tampa and Newport News will be in the neighbor hood of 12,000 or 14,000 men.

UNCLE SAM'S TERMS FOR PEACE.

Madrid, June 25.—It is reported here the peace conditions suggested by the United States includes the possession of Porto Rico, the independence of Cuba with an American protectorate, a naval station in the Philippines, and a coal depot in the Canaries.

ANOTHER PRIZE.

Jim West, June 25.—A two-masted vessel, the Ampana of Honduras, was brought in here this morning in charge of Eugenio Zorn, of the Vicksburg. She was captured yesterday afternoon while leaving Havana and attempting to run the blockade. She was quickly overhauled, and the Vicksburg found over 30 women and children and a number of men on board. The crew and passengers are all refugees.

GRIDLEY'S BODY CREMATED.

San Francisco, June 25.—The body of Captain Charles V. Gridley, commander of the Olympia who died shortly after the battle of Manila Bay, was cremated in Hong Kong June 2. The ashes were deposited in the Hong Kong English cemetery to await the wishes of the relatives.




