It is not too much to say that there never has been in the State of Oregon a more important gathering than the farmers' convention, now in session in Astoria. Such a movement means the speedy revolutionizing of the dairying interests of the whole state, and Clatsop, pre-eminently a dairying county, has properly taken the lead in this great work. The Pacific Coast state that best learns to develop and foster its farming interests will be the first to increase in population and wealth. Today some of the best brains of the country, as well as its best muscle and dogged physical energy, are being put into the farm all over the land. Two blades of grass are grown where formerly there was but one. Some of the finest farmers in this part of the great West are now in Astoria. They are practical men and are giving practical lessons in the various phases of dairy farming. That there will follow here from the work of these men similar results to those realized in Minnesota, where there are now six hundred modern dividend paying creameries, all started from the results following a single one, cannot be doubted. It is a credit to the state that the people of Clatsop County are the first in this field of endeavor, and the matter has been taken hold of so earnestly that its success is already assured.

TERMS OF PEACE

Philadelphia Times. At any time before the beginning of actual war between Spain and the United States, Spain could have had peace by conceding the independence of Cuba, but she wouldn't. Now after losing two-thirds of her navy, she would gladly make peace by the absolute surrender of Cuba, but it can't be accepted. Peace can't be had between Spain and the United States without the absolute surrender by Spain of all her West India and Pacific possessions. Cuba must be made free under an American protectorate. Porto Rico must become an American province, and the Philippine, the Ladrones and the Caroline Islands in the Pacific, which have been Spanish possessions for more than three centuries, must be surrendered by Spain to be disposed of as the United States shall deem best. The American people have not started out on any crusade for empire. Circumstances over which they had no control and conditions which they did not create, have placed our government in a position

that necessitates a radical departure from its long time policy of confining its area and authority to this continent. Cuba must now become an independent Republic. Porto Rico must come to us in demerit for the war, and the annexation of Hawaii necessitates American ports in the Ladrones, Carolines and Philippine Islands and the early construction of the Nicaragua Canal.

This new and momentous departure from the policy of this government was not dreamed of even during the late Presidential election. It came upon us unbidden, but the American people as with one voice, accept it and the government could not with safety make peace without ending Spanish authority in every province of the West Indies and the Pacific. The safety of our government; the advancement of civilization; the great lesson that it has become our duty to teach Spain and the civilized world of the high obligations of humanity which rest upon nations as well as individuals, forbid the semblance of Spanish authority in any of the islands in the East or West.

If the war shall be prolonged despite the capture of Santiago and our fleet shall be forced to assault Spain on her own coast, the Canary Islands will also be taken from her. It will be done on the sound principle that Spain is unfit to govern any colony, and that every dictate of enlightened civilization and humanity requires that her authority should be confined to her own people within the confines of Spain herself. If her people shall submit to her theft and oppression, it is their own affair; but every indication points to early revolution and the utter overthrow of Spanish royalty.

It is needless now to discuss the details of peace beyond what shall be required of Spain. She must give up her West India and Pacific possessions and the disposal of them will be wholly within the power of the United States. No foreign government will be permitted to interfere in the possession of the Philippine, the Ladrones and the Caroline Islands in the Pacific, or Porto Rico in the West Indies, until peace shall be made between Spain and the United States, and all diplomatic efforts for international interests in any of those islands must be made solely with our government. Peace will come and it is not far distant, and when it comes, Spain will be without a province in the West Indies or the Pacific, and the United States will determine for herself what international interests, if any, shall attach to either of her newly acquired possessions.
