It is said that Cervera knew nothing of Dewey's victory until he was taken aboard the St. Louis. He had no trouble, however, in picturing to his mind how it was done. He had witnessed a life-sized reproduction of it in front of Santiago.

The London Spectator gives the following opinion as to the character of our Spanish foes: "A Spaniard is the kind of a man who always leaves his revolver unloaded, and, discovering the fact, walks to his death unarmed, lest somebody should suppose he is afraid."

An appeal has been made to German-Americans, asking them to build a warship and present it to the government, the ship to be named "The Teutonic." It would shock the divine Kaiser to the quick to see with what enthusiasm the sturdy fellows from the fatherland are preparing for a possible war with him and his kind. The Germans never had much of a fancy for kings anyhow.

GREAT BATTLES.

Compared with the mortality of the great battles of our Civil War—when Americans were fighting Americans—the loss inflicted upon our gallant soldiers in front of Santiago is not remarkable.

In all, counting five thousand Cubans engaged, there were approximately 21,000 troops opposed to the Spaniards behind breast works. If there have been as many as 1,000 casualties from wounds, heat prostrations and capture, that would be only a little more than 4 per cent.

A study of some of the great battles of the Civil War will show how much greater losses were there.

At Gettysburg there were 37,000 killed, 14,000 wounded and 5,000 missing, a total loss of 21,000. The entire Union forces in the battle are estimated at about 93,000 giving the percentage of loss as about 23.

At Spotsylvania the percentage of loss was about 11. In the Wilderness it was 15. In the battle of Manassas, one of the bloodiest large engagements in the history of war, the percentage of loss on the Union side was 42 and about the same on the Confederate side. Cold Harbor was one of the fiercest contests of the war, with a percentage of loss approximately 22 per cent.

This comparison is as creditable to the tactics of the managers of the American troops at Santiago as it is discreditable to the gunnery of the Spaniards, who had that most dreaded of all dread advantages, ample and strong protection behind breastworks, with guns and ammunition superior to ours.

OREGON WHEAT AND SALMON.
San Francisco Herald of Trade.

On account of the great commercial importance of the salmon industry on the

Columbia River—which, by the way, is not its proper name, as it was christened the "River Oregon"—it may be interesting to know that Mr. McKean, who died in Portland about the year 1884, was the first man to drag a seine in that majestic river, and the first man to pack his product in barrels and ship them to market. It was in the year 1884 that Mr. McKean located on Sand Island and inaugurated an industry that cost him \$3,000 out of pocket. He paid enormous prices for his barrels, salt and labor, and shipped his pack to this city, where he failed to find a market. He paid storage for nearly a year, ordered the consignment dumped into the bay, piled his nets in a corner of his cabin and left up-river for civilization. This was the inauguration of salmon packing, which cost the originator a neat sum of money, but in subsequent years others have realized many millions of dollars from this gigantic industry.

It may also be of some interest to our Web-foot brethren and others to know that it was in the same year—1884—that the first cargo of wheat was shipped from Oregon. It went out on the brig Sally Brown and landed in New York, where it could not be sold at any price. Wooden nutmegs and hams, and wagons trined with painted cowhides, were being launched on the market at that time, and so large, plump and white were the grains of the Oregon wheat that the wheat buyers and mill men said it had been swollen by "some d—d Yankee process," and refused to buy it at all. The brig was loaded by growers and merchants, and like the salmon speculation was a dead loss. Among the shippers was old "Uncle Billy" Rector and Joseph Watt—who was afterward known all through that primitive region as "Sheep Joe." Although this was what might be called an "early day," the writer was there in proper person.
