DUTIES AT SANTIAGO.

Bianco Will Regulate Spanish Tariff at Havana.

General Blanco has sent a cable message to General Toral, asking what duties have been imposed at Santiago, with view to regulating the tariffs at Havans. At the request of the merchants, Custums Collector Donnidson has asked General Lawton to decide whether or not duty paid on goods entered at the port Santingo shall be refunded on transhipment to such ports as Cienfuegoes and Manzanillo, which are still in posession of the Spaniurds.

Plans are being prepared and surveys nade for a street sewerage scheme in Santhago.
