WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.-The board of naval bureau chiefs, which has been care fully examining the large number of bids pedo boat destroyers, has almost com pleted the work and within a day or so is expected to report to Acting Secretary Allen a plan for the distribution of the awards.

The work has been difficult because of the multiplicity of plans and the originality displayed by some of the bidders. The decision arrived at by the board is to distribute the craft as follows among the bidders:
