Mr. Hill showed that we can produce wheat and other agricultural products as well as manufactured goods in greater quantities and at less cost than any other country in the world, and that our railways give cheaper transportation than any other carriers in the world. But when it comes to disposing of our products in the world's markets we are at a deeided disadvantage because of our tack of an American merchant marine. Mr. Hol made the declaration that a bonus of \$2 per ton would insure the building of ships as fast as the shippards could turn them out. A ship of 5,000 tons canacity leaving the Pacific coast every day in the year would carry more than 1,500,000 tons annually across the Pacific ocean to Asia. A honus of \$2 per ton on this would amount to \$3,000,000 per year, and for ten years would not amount to more than the river and harbor bill which, as Mr. Hill says, "has paid so many politisal debts and done so little good.




