It is the unmistakable evidence that Astoria is to be made the exporting point for the four transcontinental railroads.

No one, though, can doubt that the fullness of time will show the great warehouse at Flavel. The present great dock is only for immediate pressing needs. It is only a beginning, though it equals Portland's loaded dock in size. It evidences the fact that the promoters of the A. & C. R. R. contemplate gigantic movements of wheat from this port. They evidently think all the wheat that could not stand on my feet ten miles.

FRESH WATER FOR NAVAL VESSELS. Tacoma Lodge: Already a great many vessels have been placed in the naval reserve at League Island, Pennsylvania. It is the policy of all governments with large naval establishments to keep the majority of their men-of-war in reserve during peace. The vessels retain their batteries, stores, and a limited number of men on board to keep them in condition to be fully commissioned within a few days at the declaration of war.

The introduction of steel for shipbuilding has made it necessary to lay up the naval reserve vessels in fresh water, to preserve their bottoms from the very rapid deterioration in salt water. Our government at great expense has dug a basin at League Island which will accommodate a limited number of our vessels when placed in reserve. Unfortunately, the tides bring some salt water even that far up the Delaware, and the ice is injurious in the winter. So it is not an ideal place, but the best that can be found on the Atlantic coast.

Another argument in favor of a large navy yard on Puget sound, which Commodore Endicott overlooked, is the proximity of Lake Washington. When the government canal is completed the battleships can have their bottoms cleaned at Port Orchard and can then be placed in reserve at Lake Washington. There is perfect protection, no salt water, no fleas, plenty of room for storehouses, drill grounds, etc., near a large city, and the vessels' bottoms will be perfectly preserved. While a navy yard might not be located on the lake, on account of the possible treacherous destruction of the canal locks in war times, and its inaccessibility for injured vessels for repairs, it is the ideal place for vessels of the naval reserve. As the larger half of the navy must be retained on the Pacific side, Lake Washington becomes invaluable to the navy as an adjunct to Puget sound navy yard at Port Orchard. Now, California has no fresh water lake for the naval reserve, and it would be a great mistake for the government to build navy yards so far from a fresh water harbor, and all naval material, notwithstanding Commodore Endicott's advice.
