The steamship Columbia, which arrived from the river yesterday and sailed for San Francisco, carried the remains of the late Mayor W. S. Mason, of Portland. The body will be buried in the Masonic cemetery in the Bay City.

Mayor Bergman yesterday signed the ordinance extending the time for the improvement of Astor street from April 1 to May 1. It is thought the street can be finished inside of 10 days, should the weather continue favorable.

County Judge Gray will today visit the John Day balance drawbridge, which has been completed by the contractors. He will go on the launch Hawthorn. She will leave the Clatsop mill dock at 11:30 this morning. Commissioner Lewis will also be on hand to pass upon the new structure. The draw works perfectly. This style of bridge is an innovation on the old style and saves the county to the present instance, about \$25. The visit is made by Judge Gray for the purpose of viewing the work before it is accepted at the next regular term of the county court.

Merchants generally are elated over the prospects of another steamship line to San Francisco. The matter has been taken hold of by the Wholesale Grocers' Association of San Francisco and if Astoria businessmen will patronize the new line, it will be secured. Nothing can be expected from Portland, which does all its business with the O. R. & N. Co., and it rests with the merchants of this city whether or not the new line will be secured. Better rates will be given on San Francisco-Astoria freight, and there are many other reasons why the new line should be encouraged. The Progressive Commercial Association will co-operate with the Grocers' Association in securing business for the proposed opposition line.

The Taxpayers' League held its regular weekly meeting last night in the Chamber of Commerce rooms. There was a large attendance. Several matters came up for discussion, among which was that of the city charging interest on delinquent assessments remaining unpaid on street improvements. It was the sense of the meeting that the city should charge interest in such cases, and the matter was referred to a committee to advise with the proper authorities. Reports were received from various committees and the progress being made was discussed at length. No definite action was taken at last night's meeting, but the standing committees will continue their work until the next meeting of the league.

The Elder arrived yesterday from San Francisco. She was light in cargo, having on board six iron ore cars and a small quantity of freight. There is a feeling among the officers that the Elder will be chartered by the government as a transport to Manila. In the event of additional troops being sent to the Philippines to reinforce O'Leary, which now seems certain, it is believed the Elder will be engaged for the work. A general report of the steamer's condition has been placed before the secretary of war. It is expected it will be acted on favorably and additional transports be required, as the Elder is in many ways better equipped for such service than the vesicular ferries engaged by the government.

It is seldom such a Chinese pageant is witnessed in Astoria as that which took place yesterday at the funeral of Lam Poo. The services commenced at 2 o'clock at the corner of Eighth and Bond, by the Masons to which order the deceased Chinese belonged. Tributes to the dead, according to the Chinese custom, were paid the departed Mason and full-robed Mongolians standing in line near the coffin chanted the rites of the order. Timbals and tom-toms were beaten with a will and made a perfect din in the vicinity. Two tables laden with roast pig, rice, tea, and gin, and other eatables were laid conveniently near the coffin. The food remained untouched, but was tempting enough to make a hungry man's mouth water. After the services were over a procession was formed and the corpse proceeded to the telephone dock. The body was shipped on the Telephone last night to Portland for burial.

There is every prospect of a lively rate-war for the lower Columbia river business this summer, says the Telegram. The Astoria & Columbia River railroad and the White Collar line have failed to convince the O. R. & N. that it is doing wrong by reducing rates between Portland and Astoria. Representatives of the opposing lines sought to induce the O. R. & N. to restore the old rates, but without avail. There will be a larger season's business on the lower Columbia and the O. R. & N. proposes to handle the bulk of the trade. The opposing lines, however, still have not yet met the cheap rate, nor are they likely to do so until there is no further hope. Thus far the steamer Lardine is the only other boat that has met the rate. It quotes fares as \$1.20 one way, and \$1.80 round trip the same as the O. R. & N. If the opposition lines once start to slashing rates there will be a merry time, and those flocking to the seaside this summer will be given a chrome in addition to a free ride.

There is considerable speculation as to what the council and the police commission will do with the communication from the Taxpayers' League. The council has asked the council to reduce the number of street lights one-half. The impulsive manner in which the council refused to consider the communication at its special meeting Tuesday evening makes it appear probable that the letter will be received and placed on file. A councilman who usually votes with the majority said last night that he thought the council would take no action. "Of course," he said, "we will carefully consider every suggestion that may be made regarding the city government, but I am of the opinion that the council will not reduce the number of lights now in use." The police commission has been asked to reduce the force, but it is impossible to get a statement from the members of the board as to the action they propose to take. It is generally believed, however, that the commission does not favor a reduction. The matter will be taken up Monday night.

From present indications there will be much more logging in Clatsop county the coming summer than for some years past. Recently a company was organized in San Francisco, with plenty of capital, to purchase timber land in this vicinity. Many timber claims were bought up. It is the intention of this company to place its mill in operation immediately. The land owned by the company is situated along Young's river. The mill will be located in the timber and the lumber will be dumped down to deep water. The company intends to build a six-mile trestle from Young's river lake and in anticipation of trouble in securing the necessary rights-of-way, has secured the aid of the Push Club in securing it. The manager of the company has been in the city, but returned to San Francisco to report to the directors of the company. The capacity of the mill has not been made known. Extensive logging operations are being carried on in the vicinity of Seaside and the output of logs this summer will probably be quite large. Spruce is in good demand and brings an excellent price.

Alaskan sentiment has been strongly stirred by the action of Canadian police at the White Pass summit, whereby a United States inspector conveying a list of names was abruptly stopped at the summit, the goods confiscated and the inspector compelled to return empty-handed to Skagway. Some of the citizens of Skagway do not hesitate to suggest that retaliation is the only effectual remedy. Commenting on the occurrence referred to, the Daily Alaskan of March 23 says editorially under the head of "Another Summit Outrage": "As the Canadian officials at the summit seem determined to provoke the Americans into a conflict by their arbitrary declaration that the summit must be accepted as the boundary line, while in fact it is now in order for Deputy Collector Andrews to retaliate in kind and stop every British subject landing at this point and exact duty from him for every article of contraband carry before he shall be allowed to proceed any further.
