The question is asked the Astorian why, if wheat brings a dollar a ton more at Tacoma than at Portland, as shown in the Oregonian's statement of Tuesday, so much more wheat is shipped to Portland than to Tacoma? The explanation is simple: The railroads, being in combination, and charging the same common rate from interior points to Portland and Tacoma regardless of distances, and dividing the total proceeds of the business upon an agreed pro rata basis, naturally prefer to have the wheat go over the down grades of the O. R. & N. to Portland for the sake of the saving in operating expenses. Then, too, by dropping the wheat at Portland, the railroad combination is enabled to get two additional whacks out of it: (1) in the larger quantity that must be carried from the Portland market to San Francisco than would be the case if it were unloaded at Tacoma, and (2) in the operation by the O. R. & N. of the only steamers between Portland and San Francisco, whereas there are several independent lines out of Tacoma. But even this is not all the profit to the pool in shipping at Portland instead of Tacoma. The lower price of wheat at Portland—due to the higher charter rates demanded by ship owners—enables the wheat pool to make a greater margin on transshipments to San Francisco than is possible at Tacoma. The next question perhaps, that may arise in the minds of those interested in studying these abnormal conditions is: "Why do the people of Tacoma and Seattle submit to this discrimination against them in the wheat traffic?" The answer to this question is of most vital concern to every business man unconnected with the great wheat pool in Portland, but the Oregonian never makes the slightest reference to it in any of its discussions of the Portland situation. At the last session of the Washington legislature the farmers of the eastern section of the state undertook to have a law passed requiring the railroads to exchange cars on demand of the shipper at any of their junction points. The law was intended to enable wheat raisers on the various feeders and branch lines of the O. R. & N. and the other companies to transfer wheat at junction points from the O. R. & N. to the lines of the Sound railroads for shipment to Tacoma and Seattle. It would seem to the casual observer that such a bill ought to receive the hearty support of all the Sound roads as well as the people of Tacoma and Seattle, but such was not the case.
