Astoria being a seaport town, it is but natural that the military spirit along with other matters of a public nature should pervade of a nautical turn of character. This being the case, when Astoria passed the first towns on the Pacific coast to organize a naval militia force, it was on April 12, 1895, the anniversary of the battle of Bunker Hill—that the Second division, naval battalion of the Oregon national guard, was mustered into the ranks again. The roster contained the names of 21 young men and the officers chosen for the division were nominated and the men made every effort to prepare themselves for actual service. Lieutenant Sherman, through the state officials, placed his command at the service of the navy department and he received the assurance that should the services of the naval reserves be required in the Pacific, that the Astoria division would be assigned to a war ship.

The division had not yet received orders when the Spanish war broke out, but receiving these and their uniforms a week after their organization they were able to make their first public appearance and took part in the exercises on that day. Thus more than half the experiences of their friends in the splendid manner in which they filled their part of the program. In the celebration of the Fourth of July the naval reserve took a prominent part and were a leading feature in the program.

When the fleet regatta was held in due course, the Astoria division was under orders for the entire three days and continued very largely to attend the annual races that were held.

In the various parades and exercises the home division made quite a good appearance in their uniforms and discipline and were a credit to the Port.
