GERMANS ARE ANGLO-SAXONS.

The evident purpose of the Bryan managers to attempt to catch German-American votes through an appeal to their supposed hatred of England is attracting much attention in eastern political circles. Foremost among the newspapers actively engaged in heading off this unpatriotic scheme for sowing dissension among citizens of foreign extraction in this country by working on their old-world prejudices is the Chicago-Times Herald, whose owner and editor is one of the most prominent Germans in America. A number of good articles have lately been published in the Times-Herald on that subject, and they deserve as wide a circulation as possible in the republican papers of the Pacific coast. The people of foreign birth in this country are all supposed to be of one nation—that is, Americans. The man or set of men who may undertake to inject European quarrels or jealousies among our people for the sake of political aggrandizement ought to be severely condemned by adopted citizens from every country. Such an effort as the Bryan party is now making deserves the same execration that would be visited upon any organization of white men who attempted a campaign among the negroes of the south for the purpose of stirring up a racial insurrection. Sometime ago a meeting of German-Americans was held in Detroit and a number of Bryanites, in outside attendance, succeeded in steering through the meeting what they called a "protest against an alliance between England and America." The Times-Herald has published what it terms "a sharp and timely rebuke" to these un-American Germans, administered by Congressman Theobald Otjen of Milwaukee. It is a rebuke, coming from a German, that merits the thoughtful consideration of the few Americans of German birth who have been foolishly frightened over the talk of Anglo-Saxon alliance. Congressman Otjen, who is, according to his own characterization, "an American citizen of German origin," is not disturbed by the discussion of the possibilities of an Anglo-American understanding. "On the contrary," he takes pride in the contemplation of the well-known fact that German-Americans are in reality a part of the Anglo-Saxon race. In his significant answer to the resolutions adopted at the Detroit meeting he says:

"Anglo-Saxon simply means a person of English-Saxon blood. I, as an American citizen of German birth, am proud to be called or classed with the Anglo-Saxons. That German-American who is offended at being called or classed with the Anglo-Saxons, is, in my opinion, denying himself a large part of the glory and honor due to the race—namely, that the basic blood of the three greatest nations of the earth, America, England and Germany, is of Germanic origin."

The Times-Herald makes the following interesting comment on Congressman Otjen's expressions. It says:

"The Milwaukee congressman is merely referring his countrymen to the facts of history. The Saxon was originally a member of a Teutonic tribe formerly occupying Holstein, and later also the district now included in Hanover and Oldenburg (Germany), which, in connection with the Angles and Jutes, conquered England in the fifth and sixth centuries. The Teuton, as everybody knows, was a member of a tribe of Germans that dwelt north of the Elbe, although the term is now generally applied to all members of the German race. It is impossible therefore to get away from the fact that there is Teutonic blood in the Anglo-Saxon race and that the Germans may easily claim a share of the glory that belongs to the achievements of Anglo-Saxon progress and civilization. As a matter of fact, the word 'Anglo-Saxon' was originally applied to the people formed from a mixture of Angles and Germans, and the language they spoke was designated by lexicographers as 'Low German.' With these facts concerning the origin of the races before them the German-

Americans are engaged in foolish business when they get together to frame resolutions against any movement that is calculated to promote a better understanding between the various branches of the Anglo-Saxon race."

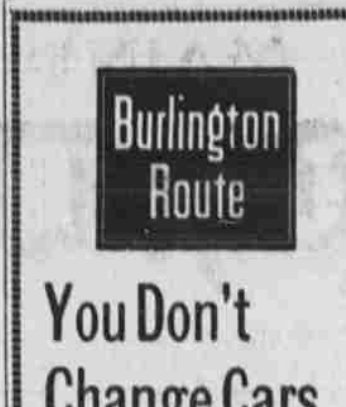
