

The commission associations at the terminal markets will be governed by boards of directors ranging from 5 to 9 in number, who will select the manager, hire employees and de-

No contract to be signed by the members is contemplated.

The sub-committee on co-operative marketing will call a conference to be held in Chicago September 2, to work out a standardized plan for the organization and management of cooperative live stock shipping associations. An effort wil be made to outline the ideal shipping association.
