Repeal of Income Surtax Rates Above 32 Per Cent Is Cause of Opposition.

Washington, D. C .- The tax revision bill of 1921, estimated to cut \$818,803, 000 from the nation's tax burden by 1923, was passed by the house, 274 to 125, on almost straight party vote.

Three democrats voted for the bill; while nine republicans voted against it. Democrats voting for were Camp-Lazaro, both of Louisiana.

Republicans voting against the bill were Beek, Wisconsin; Clasue, Min-Mr. McNealy and Elmer Mathews of nesotn; Keller, Minnesota; Lambert, Wisconsin; Michaelson, Illinois; John M. Nelsen, Wisconsin; Sinclair, North Dakota: Voigt, Wisconsin; Woodruft,

Representative London, socialist, of New York, voted against the bill,

Compared with this number of republicans were 50 who voted for a democratic motion to recommit the bill for elimination of the provision repealing the income surtax rates above 32 per cent. This motion was lost, 169 to 230, with one democrat, Campbell of Pennsylvania, voting against it. The bill now goes to the senate,

and higher income surfaxes would not become effective until January 1, next, the full force of the bill will not be reflected in tovernment receipts until the calendar year 1923, but republican lenders said that the repeal of the transportation and other taxes and reduction in the tax bill in the next calendar year will be approximately \$512,000,000;
