These gases are often present la sufficient quantities to produce disagreeable symptoms, or even cause death. The effect of these gases is produced very quickly, naually before the victim realizes the danger. Observe the following at all times:

Always open the garage door before starting the engine

Do not allow the engine to run for . any length of time in closed garage. Do not work near the exhaust of a unning auto-nobile engine.


Special precautions as to ventilation are necessary when in garage
