The copper carbonate dust treatment of seed wheat for smut control cannot be expected to give the best results when the open box floor, or canvas method of mixing is employed. The powder is mixed with the grain at the rate of two ounces to each bushel, but 100 per cent control calls for the use of a special mixing device. Farmers are not counseled against this treatment provided they can mix it properly.-O.A.C. Experiment station.

In making silage corn should be cut when the kernel is fairl hard but before the stalk and leaves get dr.y Barley and peas at about the same stage as for hay. OREGON'S POTATO CROP MENACED BY MOSAIC

Must Prevent Incurable Disease in Seed Stocks if Industry Endures

Potato mosaic is one of the disstock no means are known of eradicating it or ever getting tubers fit for seed from it. high time for growers and potato scientists to begin a field search for in the fall are usually good annual disease-free potatos of the right sort for sourcesof seed.

The search must begin in the field, as the presence of mosaic and vines only. Even there it is not always easily recognized, and where possible the grower unless well informed on this disease himself needs the help of a specialist.

The grower is advised by M. B. McKay, potato disease specialist at the O.A.C. Experiment station, to go into the field now while the vines are still green and growing, and stake those most vigorous and tree from evidences of discuse. After the vines die down it will not be possible to detect mosaic and whit Final selection of the seed will then be made from the staked hills.

Even certification is no insurance against presence of mosaic, as slight infection may be brought into plants by aphis carrying the virus, giving but little indication in the parent stock but coming out strong in the new crop. 
