

Olympia, Wash.-The cornerstone of he administrative building, the prinapal structure of the magnificent apitol group of the state of Washacton, was laid in Olympia Saturday, ust 100 feet from where the first building ever erected for legislative surposes once stood.

FARMER AID IS PROPOSED

Bill Would Provide Loans to Buy Seed for New Crops.

Washington, D. C .- Provision for dvances to farmers of crop failure areas of the United States with which to buy seed grain was made in a bill introduced by Senator Harreld, republican, Oklahoma, which would authorze the secretary of agriculture to make loans in 1923 aggregating \$500,

The bill fixed a limit of \$300 that may be advanced to any one farmer.
