VETERANS PLEDGE TO WORK FOR PEACE

New York.—A pledge, binding 15,000,000 allied world war veterans to work for peace, was signed at the Hotel Pennsylvania by the representatives of the eight nations who are members of the Interallied Veterans Federation.

It was the final act of the 23 veterans from the seven European powers who have been in this country the past two weeks. They sailed Saturday on the George Washington.

Colonel Alvin Owsley of Texas, the newly elected national commander of the American Legion, was present at the signing.

The pledge with its signatures of the delegates represents the strength of practically all the world war veteran organizations of the nations holding membership in the federation. They will work for peace, the thing the veterans came to this country to work for.

BRIEF GENERAL NEWS

Tests conducted by the British Imperial Institute place the Douglas fir at the head of the list of woods for joinery purposes, according to a preliminary statement.

Omaha was the warmest city in the United States Saturday when the thermometer reached 90 degrees. Dodge City, Kan., was next warmest with a temperature of 88 degrees.

Mainloba has recommended that the dominion government ask the United States department of justice to wage war against bootleggers and criminals said to be making their headquarters in Minot, N. D.

Combined resources and liabilities of the twelve federal reserve banks at the close of business October 25 were \$5,965,095,000 and the ratio of total reserves to deposit and federal reserve note liabilities combined was 77.9 per cent.

A government deficit of nearly a billion dollars for the next fiscal year confronts the administration, it was disclosed by estimates of the budget officers. The president and his advisers are said to be considering recommending legislative proposals to congress.

"Either criminal or civil suits, and in many cases both, will be necessary in innumerable instances if the government is to recover even a part of the fabulous sums paid out as a result of fraudulent or improperly executed war contracts," the department of justice declared.

Conference to Unite Rail Bodies.

St. Paul, Minn.—A national conference of railroad men "to devise ways and means" of effecting an amalgamation of the sixteen standard railroad organizations will be held in Chicago, December 9 and 10. C. H. Wangerin, of St. Paul, secretary there of the national committee on amalgamation, announced here.

Sex Problems to be Taught.

Chicago, Ill.—Medical certificates will be required from all members of the Episcopal church who marry in Chicago, under the terms of a resolution adopted at a meeting of the rectors of the diocese. The resolution also provided that problems of sex be taught in Episcopal Sunday schools.

Apples in Danger of Freezing.

Wenatchee, Wash.—With only 4000 carloads of apples shipped out of a total of 13,000, and with only storage capacity available for about 5000 cars, there are fully 4900 cars of apples which will soon be exposed to damage from freezing.

FAIRMOUNTS

The date prune, Comtes 1418, is derived from the prune, which is reasonable, explains W. S. Brown, chief of horticulture at the O. A. C. experiment station. The date prune is much larger than the petite, most of the dried fruit running 20 to 40 to the pound. So heavily does it dry out that two pounds of the fresh will make nearly one pound of the dried product.

The new prune is a mutant, or bud sport, not yet "fixed" in the sense that all the bearing wood will always bear the best quality of date prune. It is a version of the petite prune.

Care must be exercised by the nurseryman to prevent this reversion to the petite ancestor cautions Professor Brown. Growers may well investigate the source of their trees and the ability of their nurseryman before buying.

Apple Varieties Many. Not All are Well Known

Apple varieties need to be carefully thought out before winter and spring planting, reports the experiment station at O. A. C. The common varieties are well known to most persons but there are several fine eastern sorts that would make a desirable addition to the table if grown for home use.

Desirable early varieties include the Early Harvest, Sweet Bough, Golden Sweet, Yellow Transparent, and the Gravenstein. Fall and early winter apples such as the Melon, Moller, Twenty-ounce Pippin, Fall Pippin, Pumpkin Sweet, McIntosh, Baby Sweet, Wealthy, and Seek-No. Further are good varieties to plant. For late varieties the Gillflower, Dutch Mignon, Golden Russet, Roxbury Russet, Lady Apple, Northern Spy, Tollman Sweet, and the Swaar are very desirable.

Sweet apples occupy an important place in this list. It is peculiar that so few varieties of sweet apples are at present grown in the northwest.

The fall rains are favoring abundant infections for peach blight, apple tree anthracnose, loganberry anthracnose, die-back and heart rot fungi in small fruits and orchard trees. A thorough coating of freshly prepared home-made Bordeaux mixture is the best protection during the rainy season and winter for all this class of troubles.

Buy only the best bee supplies. This is particularly important when purchasing hive bodies and frames. A metal covered telescope cover will be found far superior to any other, especially in the danger sections of the northwest. Order your supplies early so as to have everything ready before the rush of spring work starts.

The best flavored elder is made by using equal parts of sweet and sour one-third of sour apples may be used or just the reverse, depending upon the kind of elder desired.

Eye grass fall sowed may be used crop the next summer. It is an easy crop to handle, requires no special machinery. Annual crops to the United States are large and much of it is used in seeding pasture and old burns in the Pacific Northwest.

For late sowing of wheat, oats or barley, more seed must be used. Gray oats is one of the best crops for late sowing. Winter rye is also a good crop to sow on cold land.

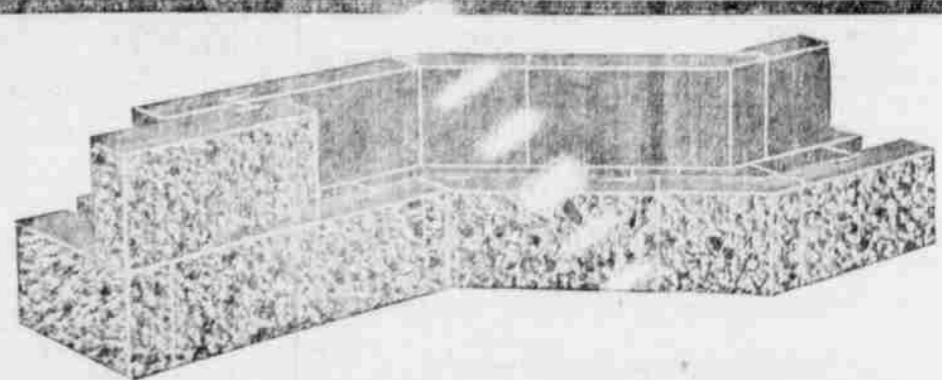
