VETERANS PLEDGE TO WORK FOR PEACE

New York.-A piedge, binding 15, 600,000 allied world war veterans to work for peace, was signed at the Hotel Pennsylvania by the representathes of the eight nations who are members of the interailled Veteran Federation.

It was the final act of the 23 veterans from the seven European powers who have been in this country the past two weeks. They sailed Saturday on the George Washington

Colonel Alvin Owsley of Texas, the newly elected national commander of the American Legion, was present at the signing.

The pledge with its signatures of he delegates represents the strength of practically all the world war veteran organizations of the nations hold ing membership in the federation. hey will work for peace, the thing the veterans came to this country to

A government deficit of nearly a billion dollars for the next fiscal year confronts the administration, it was disclosed by estimates of the budget officers. The president and his advisers are said to be considering recommending legislative proposals to congress.

"Either criminal or civil suits, and in many cases both, will be necessary in innumerable instances if the government is to recover even a part of the fabulous sums paid out as a result of fraudulent or improperly executed war contracts," the department of justice declared.

Conference to Unite Rail Bodles.

St. Paul, Minn.-A national conference of railroad men "to devise ways and means" of effecting an amalgamation of the sixteen standard railroad organizations will be held in Chicago, December 9 and 10, C. H. Wangerin, of St. Paul, secretary there of the national committee on amaigamation, announced here.

Sex Problems to be Taught. Chicago, Ill. - Medical certificates will be required from all members of the Episcopal church who marry in Chicago, under the terms of a resolution adopted at a meeting of the rectors of the diocese. The resolution also provided that problems of sex be taught in Episcopal Sunday schools.

Apples in Danger of Freezing. Wenatchee, Wash.-With only 4000 carloads of apples shipped out of a total of 13,000, and with only storage

capacity available for about 5000 cars. there are fully 4000 cars of apples which will soon be exposed to damage from freezing.

The date prune, Coutes 1418, is derived from the prune, which is resembles, explains W. S. Brown, chief of horizonture at the O. A. C. esperiment station. The date prune is much larger that the petite, most of the dried fruit running 20 to 40 to the pound. So heavilly does it dry out that two pounds of the fresh will make nearly one pound of the dried product.

The new prune is a nutant, or bud sport, not yet "fixed" in the sense that all the hearing wood will always bear the best quality of date prune. It-versions to the pethe prune occur. Care must be excercised by the nurserymen to prevent this reversion to the petite ancestor cautions Proffessor Brewn, Growers may well investigate the source of their trees and the Hability of their nurseryman & before buying.

Apple Varieties Many. Not All are Well Known

Apple varieties need to be carefully bought out before winter and spring lanting, reports the experiment spaion at O. A. C. The common varieice are well known to most persons ut there are several fine eastern orts that would mak a desirable adtition to the table if grown for home

Desirable early varieties include he Early Harvest, Sweet Bough. olden Sweet, Yellow Transparent. id the Gravenstein. Fall and early inter apples such as the Melon, Moher, Twenty- cunce Pippin, Pall Pipin, Pumpkin Sweet, McIntosh, Baloy Sweet. Wealthy, and Seek-No. Purther are good virieties to plant. For late varieties the Gilliflour, Dutch Mignon, Golden Russet, Roxbury Russet, Lady Apple, Northern Spy, Tollman Sweet, and the Swaar re very desirable.

Sweet apples occupy an important olace in this list. It is peculiar that so few varieties of swee apples are at present grown in the northwest.

The fall rains are favoring abundant infections for peach blight, apple tree anthracnose, loganberry anthracusse, die-back and beart rot fungi n amall fruits and orchard frees. 
