Washington, D. C .- The baker of a loaf of bread receives a larger part of the price you pay therefor than any other agency entering into its production.

This is the result of an investiga tion by the department of agriculture between October, 1922, and March, 1923, which showed bakers' margins over the cost of flour ranging all the way from 4 cents on an 8-cent loaf in New Orleans, to 6 cents on a 10-cent loaf in Chicago.

Portland, Ore the producer received for the flour content in a loaf approximately 1% per cent of the retail price of the loaf 3 Japanese Pongee 2. M. M. 79 cents. Kafoury Bros., 383 Alder St. whereas from 6 to 71/2 per cent on each loaf went to pay the costs of transportation, elevator handling, flour

milling, baking and retailing. "The retail price of bread will be little affected by changes in the price of flour inasmuch as the cost of the flour entering into the bread is relatively small when compared with the other items of cost," the department

says. "Lower bread prices depend upon more efficient milling, baking and distribution methods: higher yields per barrel of flour and larger volume of business by individual bakers. By such efficiencies it may be possible to reduce the bakery's cost and to some extent his profits per unit of output."

FEEDLOT LAMENESS REQUIRES ATTENTION All farm animals are subject to foot-rot, possibly sheep more than the others. It is usually associated with dirt and barnyard filth. Mud sometimes dries between the claws to the consistency of a brick, which causes an abrasion, and this paves the way for necrophorus infection. Most outbreaks are infectious. After the lameness has become severe there is a slight discharge, with very offensive odor, and the hoof becomes rotten, usually in one spot which soon spreads to the deeper structures. After a fortnight the claws begin to separate, the animal is outhrifty and in great pain; the claws roay slough. and the animal be unable to stand if more than one foot is affected. Cases of lameness in the feed lots should not be neglected-employ a veterinarian if possible. Clean the

foot and pare away all dead tissue. Apply a two per cent solution of silver nitrate or a five per cent solution of zinc chloride. Pine tar might then be applied, and bandages placed in such a way as to not only protect the foot from dirt but to keep the claw from spreading. Keep the animal on clean, dry ground.

Sometimes it becomes necessary to treat a whole flock and special attention to individuals cannot be accomplished. In such cases the sheep may be made to stand for five minutes in a pan containing an antiseptic solution. The solution should be deep enough to cover the feet. A solution made by dissolving one pound of copper sulphate in a gallon of water may be used, or dissolve one pound of fresh chloride of lime in three gallons of water. This treatment should be repeated and continued as long as necessary. Separate the diseased animals from the herd and place them in a clean pasture.—George H. Glover, Colorado Agricultural College.

Silage With Legume Hay Is Excellent for Ewes

Corn silage is a most excellent feed for the breeding ewe, Fed alone, however, it is a poor ration. It needs balancing. In practice it is balanced to economic advantage by feeding it good quality of sweet clover, or soy bean hay. If the ewes that are fed sliage are given all of any one of these leguminous hays that they will clean up in conjunction with their sliage feed, they will take enough of the balancing hay to make the ration ac-

During the winter time a ration composed of sllage along with one or more of these leguminous hays is adequate during the early part of the season. After that, however, or about a month or so before the ewes begin to lamb, is a good plan to feed some concentrated grain or grains, such as oats. bran, barley, or corn. A mixture of oats and corn in equal parts is splendid, or barley and oats is good.

A little grain fed continuously for a month or six weeks before the lambs arrive creates a desirable reserve for future milk production.

Practice of Inbreeding

Requires Much Caution When may inbreeding be practiced? This question is answered by Prof. B. W. Fairbanks of Colorado Agricultural college as follows; When the breeder understands the fundamental principles of breeding; when he is dealing with excellent individual animals and when these animals are of good ancestry. Line breeding, he says, has all the advantages of inbreeding without its disadvantages, but there is a place for inbreeding, if practiced with discretion.
