> Washington, D. C. - Formal disapof a second defense test and a recommendation by President Coolidge that it be held on July 4, were announced by the White House.

> The president, in a letter to Acting Secretary of War Davis, suggested July 4 as a "more appropriate date" and directed the department, if it chose any other day than a national holiday, to hold its plans in abeyance until the authority of congress is se-

The president also advised the department to emphasize in its letters to governors that participation of their states in the test is "purely volun-

The war department will accept the president's suggestion and hold its defense test on July 4, it was said in well-informed quarters here.
