Ashland won four times over in the challenge issued by the young people of this city to Medford when they claimed they would send two persons to Medford's one to the young people's evening of the Jackson County Sunday school convention in session. At the count last evening Ashland had 95 representatives of the young people's societies, while Medford had 23. Both, however, were good representations and the utmost of amicability existed among the good-natured rivals. Led by Yell-leader John O. Rigg, Ashland demonstrated what they can do in the way of expressing their exuberance, and the rafters rang with their cry of victory. Medford came back at them and made up in the volume of noise what they lacked in numbers.

A good attendance greeted the popular meeting of the convention last night and listened to an exceptionally fine program. The song service was presided over by General Secretary Humbert, after which President Carson took charge of the meeting, when the vote was taken proving Ashland's victory over Medford in the numbers attending. A male quartet rendered a fine vocal selection, followed by Ralph Branton of Medford, who gave a talk on

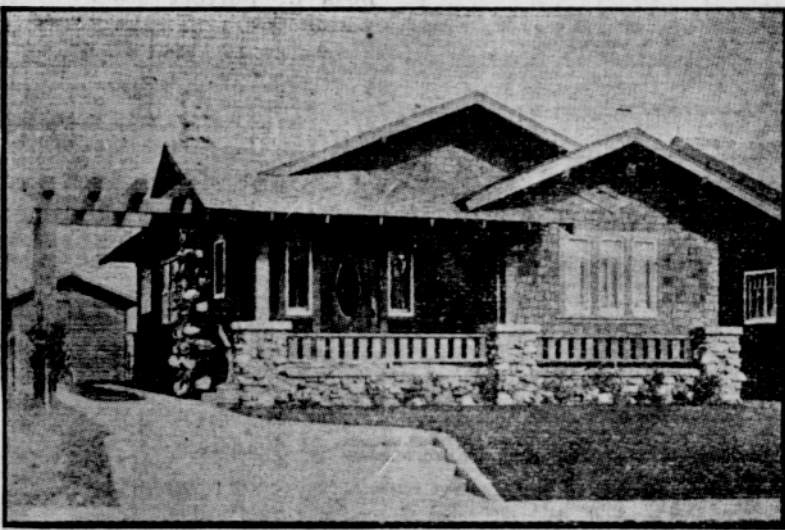

Mears and "A Church School Goal," by Harold F. Humbert, in the forenoon. In the afternoon the school of methods took up the session. This was conducted by Mr. Humbert, Miss Parker and Rev. J. W. 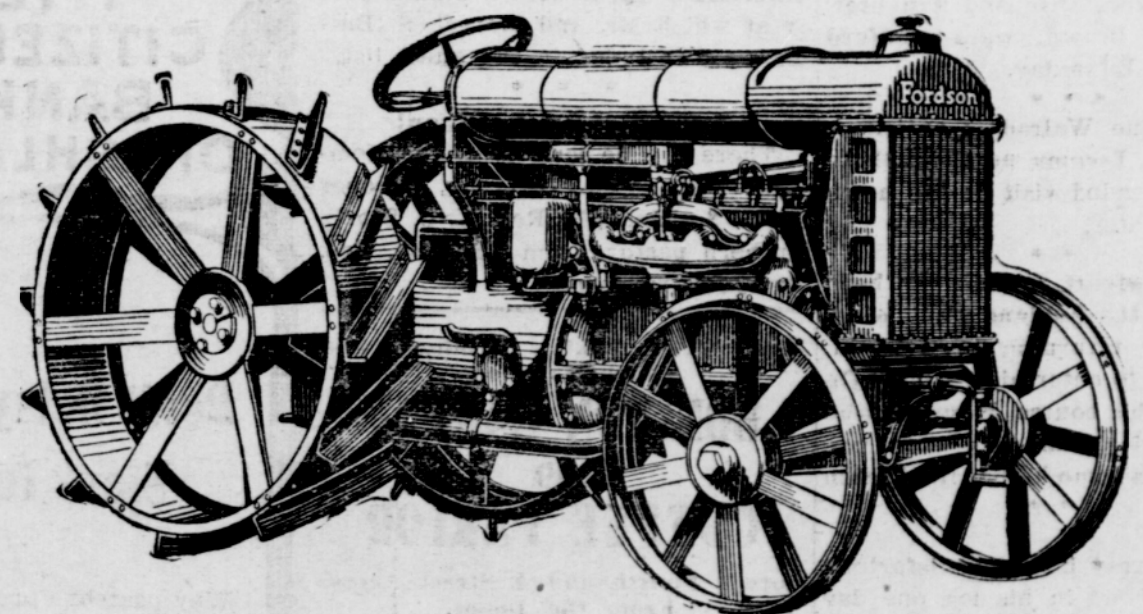
