WOOD! WOOD! LUMBER AND LAKE OF THE WOODS
What does Ashland need more? Here is how to get it: Close up your stores on November 28th from 9 to 11 a. m.
Not to go to the mountains to cut it as some suggest, but get every auto and everybody and go to school house (Bellview) and be there at 10 o'clock sharp, not to vote a tax on yourselves, but a small one on the other fellow. This is to be levied on road district No. 1, for the purpose of completing the new piece of road which has been well started around the last ridge on the Dead Indian road. This will reduce the grade of 25 per cent to 10 per cent. It will enable people with trucks to go to the timber just over the summit and get wood. There are millions of cords there to be had from private owners and the forest service very reasonable.
Trucks can then make two trips per day with half the upkeep in tires, springs, gas and oil.
There are lumber interests that will begin immediately to haul down lumber. These two interests alone will employ hundreds of men, many trucks and the money will be spent here instead of the people of Ashland paying many thousands of dollars annually to the railroad as freight on wood and lumber.
Then you can have a summer resort that you can go to and not have to push your cars part way up hill and sink your souls to lower depths by swearing as hard as nine out of ten do who try to get up there at any time when the road is not at all best. The road from the summit to the lake will be improved by the forest service and private owners as soon as the road on this side is completed to the top. It has been improved from the lake east.
Again, people from that country on the east side will come to Ashland to trade and take home loads

MAY ATTACK NON-PARTISAN STATE OFFICIALS
BISMARCK, N. D., Nov. 26. - Whether an effort to impeach three state officials, twice elected to office with the indorsement of the Non-Partisan League, but now at enmity with the leaders of the farmers' party will be made during the extraordinary session of the North Dakota legislature which opened yesterday, is a matter of speculation.
The legislature will be Non-partisan in majority. The officials who may be attacked are: William Langer, attorney general; Thomas Hall, secretary of state; and Karl Kostitzky, state auditor.
Opposition between these three officials and leaders of the league, growing for some time, culminated

LAST MONTH when Langer and Hall, as a majority of the state banking board, closed the Scandinavian American State Bank of Fargo, N. D., against the vote of the governor, third member of the board.
The bank carried paper for the league and allied organizations and was held by the banking board to be insolvent because of alleged excessive loans and farmers' post dated checks used as collateral. The Non-partisans declared this move was an attempt to break the league financially. In the North Dakota supreme court the bank was declared solvent and returned to the directors.
Matters to come before the special

session are: The federal suffrage amendment; aid for farmers in drought stricken portions of the state, and laws to facilitate carrying out the industrial program inaugurated by the farmers' legislature last January.
