PRIZE ESSAY

Following is the prize essay written by Chester Quain, aged 16 years, of the Ashland high school, which won the highest rating in Jackson county, and was one of the state prize winners:

What Are the Benefits of an Enlistment in the United States Army?

The average young man enlists in the army with the confused idea of getting a taste of adventure and travel with occasional fighting. Then he first must learn discipline and the reasons necessitating its use; for without discipline an army would become a mob. It also teaches him to see that it is necessary as a means of keeping them orderly and alert for any chance emergency that may arise demanding quick and snappy action in execution. If he is ignorant of the general form of this government and its laws he is taught to appreciate the meaning and aim of these laws and the government. This instills a certain amount of feeling for his country and its laws which may be fanned into the steadier flame of love and patriotism.

Next his association with men of all classes in life, of every race and of every creed, and the cause him to understand and appreciate others and their points of view, thus broadening his own outlook on life and the necessities of the future. Also this will tend to make him more tolerant of the needs and wishes of other men thus making for a higher citizenship, and eventual progress to a higher plane in human life and affairs. It brings out a certain moral and mental sincerity of expression that is often wanting but frank and true in every phase showing that his capacity for penetration and understanding of basic principles has been improved and benefited.

That right and justice is always better than wrong and injustice he has readily come to realize to be true in every respect and condition of life.

He is improved physically and mentally by regular routine, regular habits and hours, regular diet and medical attention which his training as a soldier has given him. For educational training he is offered courses in grammar school, high school and the equivalent of two years college training in camps and barracks. Some of the subjects he may take in these courses are: reading, writing, arithmetic, history, English and American literature, trigonometry, civil engineering, higher sciences and many others.

These courses of study, while improving his military efficiency, enables him to return to civil life ready and better equipped for co-operation in industrial, commercial and general business. Finally, however, the measure of benefit any recruit may derive from an enlistment in the United States army depends solely on himself.
