

He arrived at Ellis Island and was ordered deported in February, 1919, but was released in March and returned home. Last November in Port Angeles, Wash., he was arrested again on charges of criminal syndicalism and sabotage and held in \$20,000 bail.

Immigration officials investigated the case and, his attorney says, "judged by his name that Scotland must be his home land" and ordered him deported to that country. . Ross, so far as he knows was never in Scotland.
