ORDER In the County Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County. In the Matter of Limiting Capacity of Loads Passing Over Paved Roads in Jackson County, Oregon. At this time comes on for consideration the above entitled matter and it appearing to the Court that owing to heavily loaded trucks, the paved highways in Jackson County are being damaged by such loads. And the State Highway Commission for the State of Oregon and the County Court for Jackson County having heretofore entered into a contract whereby the Pacific Highway and other improved roads in Jackson County are to be maintained on a 50-50 basis, said State Highway Commission having demanded that the loads on the paved roads in Jackson County be limited in order to protect the pavement which has already been laid and which may hereafter be placed on the State Highways in Jackson County, and the Court at this time believing it to be the best interest of the county that an order be made to limit the loads on all paved highways within Jackson County in order that the State may be relieved to pay the expense for the maintenance of the State Highways in Jackson County as agreed to and as hereinbefore mentioned. IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the maximum capacity load for any vehicle passing over any paved highway within Jackson County, exclusive of the weight of the vehicle, be and hereby is fixed at 10,000 pounds. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that there shall be no loads pass over any paved highways in Jackson County which exceed 600 pounds to the inch width of tire on any vehicle. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Sheriff of Jackson County be and hereby is authorized and directed to employ such assistance and equipment as may be necessary for him to assist the public in ascertaining the weight and capacity of their respective vehicles. FARM POINTERS THAT POINT

Farm Bureau, O. A. C.: Josephine county farmers are organizing to buy and sell cooperatively. They will buy, store, manufacture, ship and sell farm products and supplies, among other activities. Membership is open only to members of the county farm bureau, and the fee is \$5 per member. Home Demonstration, O. A. C.: Pressure cooker and canners are among the greatest time and fuel savers in the home. It takes only 35 minutes to process peas in canning in a good canner, whereas it takes full three hours in the open hot water bath. A tough old rooster will cook tender under pressure in 30 minutes. An entire meal may be cooked in a single cooker in about one-third the time it takes to cook it in open vessels. Club Work, O. A. C.: The Kent Cookery Club of Sherman county, of five girls made enough money by cooked food sales to send two of their number to the two weeks session of club workers, O. A. C. summer school. They made their own food products. Bacteriology, O. A. C.: Canned goods even slightly discolored or of normal appearance should not be tasted, as a very little toxin of this bacteria will cause serious illness or even death. Heating all parts of the contents of the can to a boiling point will destroy the bacteria, so that the product can be fed safely to poultry. Foultry, O. A. 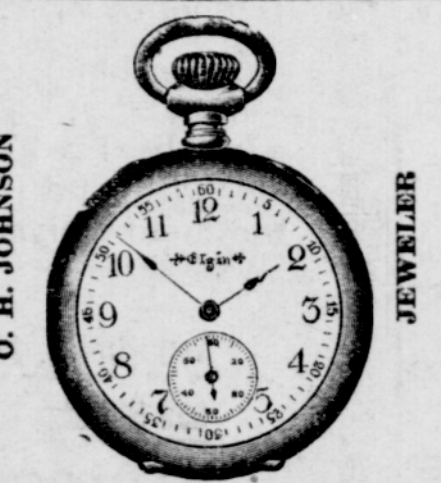

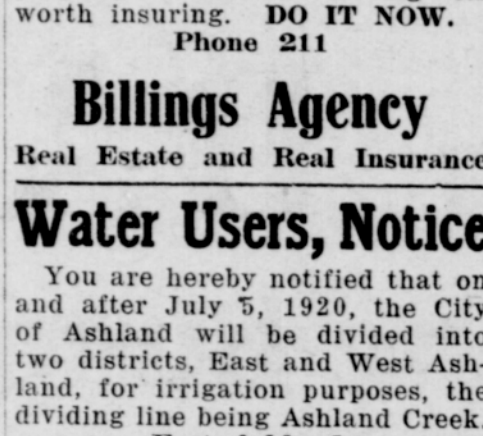

Water Users, Notice You are hereby notified that on and after July 5, 1920, the City of Ashland will be divided into two districts, East and West Ashland, for irrigation purposes, the dividing line being Ashland Creek, East Ashland. That portion of the City lying East of Ashland Creek, to be known as East Ashland, will be allowed to use the water for irrigation and sprinkling purposes on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 5 a. m. to 10 a. m. and from 5 p. m. to 10 p. m., and on Sundays from 5 a. m. to 10 a. m. West Ashland. That portion of the City lying West of Ashland Creek, to be known as West Ashland, will be allowed to use the water for irrigation and sprinkling purposes on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 5 a. m. to 10 a. m. and from 5 p. m. to 10 p. m., and on Sundays from 5 p. m. to 10 p. m. Water users are also cautioned as to the regulations against leaky faucets or fixtures of any kind and useless waste of water. Don't run water after 10 o'clock at night. Don't set sprinklers on sidewalks. All water shall be turned off immediately on sounding of the fire alarm and not turned on until one long blast of fire station whistle is sounded. All public parks in their respective districts will irrigate between the hours of 11 a. m. and 4 p. m. each day. By order of the Common Council. E. R. HOSLER, 260-3 Supt. Water Works.
