FISHING INFORMATION FOR WESTERN OREGON

Umpqua Forest Frank Brice Creek: Trout fishing good at Disston and Lund park. Auto and rail via Cottage Grove and Disston.

Layng Creek: Trout fishing good above Rujada. Auto, trail, and train via Rujada.

Row River: Redside biting at Dorena. Auto and rail from Cottage Grove.

Sharps Creek: Good trout fishing. Red Bridge to Martin Creek. Auto and rail via Cottage Grove and Dorena.

Santiam Forest

South Santiam River: Rainbows and cutthroats biting well. However, stream is over-fished. Santiam wagon road via Lebanon.

Fish and Clear Lakes: Cut-throats caught at Clear Lake, but Fish Lake dry. Santiam wagon road via Lebanon or Sisters.

CHURCH A MEANS TO MARRIAGES

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, July 17.—"The best matrimonial bureau I know of is the church," said Dr. Silas Evans, president of Occidental College, in an address on "The Present Problem of the Family," delivered to students of the Summer Session of the University of Oregon and delegates to the Synod of Oregon, in session on the University campus, at the Thursday morning assembly. "If they do get the love of God mixed up with the love of each other," he continued.

Dr. Evans declared that proper courtship was the only christian means to a happy marriage, and advocated that engagements be announced in church or in some public manner. "Marriage is decidedly not a contract," he said. "Marriage by Christians through courtship is the only free love in the world."

He also advised the poor man not to hesitate at marriage or at

marrying a girl who was used to ease and luxury, declaring that it was often good for a girl to change her method of living. The ideal marriage, according to Dr. Evans, is that of a man and woman who have grown up together, and at the same time they present their marriage certificates to the minister, also present the proper health certificates. As a final argument to the healthfulness of marriage, he said that statistics prove that between the ages of 30 and 50 years the death rate of husbands is one-half that of bachelors.

Don't Know Which Will Get Votes

(By United Press) SEATTLE, Wash., July 17.—Of 23 families in Seattle who have the name of Cox and who were interviewed, 10 stated they are opposed to him, 11 were undecided as to whether they'd mark ballots for him and only two were sure
