# JAPANESE CAN GAIN ENTRY

SACRAMENTO. — The wide open border of 190 miles or more from San Diego to eastern Arizona, permitting a steady stream of Japanese to make their way into this country in violation not only of the "gentlemen's agreement" but also of the laws of the United States, will be the subject of emphatic representations by Governor Stephens to the congressional committee now in California to investigate the immigration question. Among the facts to be presented to the committee are:  
The men on the border immigration service are only a handful in number and have repeatedly made reports to Washington of the intolerable conditions of their inability to check the unlawful entry of Japanese and of the urgent need for provision for an adequate guarding force.  
The federal government has turned a deaf ear to all those appeals and the border is today more than it ever was, an open invitation to Japanese and all sorts of smuggling.  
TRY SUBSTITUTION OF ALCOHOL FOR GAS  
PARIS. — France's expenditure abroad of 1,500,000,000 francs last year for gasoline has aroused parliament and the newspapers to a point where the government has renewed efforts to bring about industrial use of alcohol.  
Experiments here have proved to the satisfaction of investigators that automobiles and other internal combustion engines may be operated satisfactorily upon varying mixtures of alcohol and petroleum products.

## Oppose Plan To Mending Liberty Bell

PHILADELPHIA—A resolution condemning the proposed plan to restore the Liberty Bell by welding the crack in its side was unanimously adopted by the Society of the Descendants of the Signers of the Declaration of Independence, which held its thirteenth annual congress in Philadelphia. The resolution reads:  
"It is the sense of the Society of the Descendants of the Signers of the Declaration of Independence that no effort whatever be made to restore the Liberty Bell, except such repairs as may be necessary to prevent the extension of the present crack."  
Following its annual business meeting in the Bellevue-Stratford, the society met in the Declaration Chamber of Independence, Hall, and the yearly recall of the signers took place. Thirty-four descendants of sixteen signers answered at the rollcall.
