COEUR D'ALENE, Idaho, July 20—Three men were killed here about 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon when a hydro plane in which they were riding crashed to the ground on the lake shore.

The dead are: Pilot Cleo Shelton Miller, age 25, Pulman, Wash.; Peter Savage, age 30, Kellogg, Idaho; and Gus Erickson, age 30, Bonners Ferry, Idaho.

Erickson was killed instantly. Savage died on the way to the hospital and Miller lived about an hour, though never regaining consciousness.

The machine, a commercial plane, was about 100 feet above the ground when the pilot attempted to bank. Evidently there was not enough power as the machine nosed down, falling a total wreck on the beach. About 1000 people witnessed the accident.
