Ager Suggests One Central Board for County Schools

In an open letter addressed to School Board Members of Jackson county, County Superintendent of Schools G. W. Ager, whose resignation takes effect Thursday of this week, thanks all organizations, individuals and agencies who have co-operated with him; highly endorses the appointment of Miss Susanne Homes to fill the vacancy created by his resignation and gives the following suggestion which will be of interest to every county resident interested in education:

"In the hands of my successor, her principals, teachers, assistants and school officers will be left the future guidance of our schools, so possibly suggestions are unnecessary. However, I wish to add a word relative to what seems to be a trend in education in which all are vitally concerned. Our school system is undergoing an important and necessary change. Advanced steps are being taken from time to time, the process seems slow, but the time should not be far distant when the arbitrary school boundary lines will be entirely eliminated. The education of our boys and girls is a matter of concern to the state at large as well as to the individual, who under present conditions cannot give it the attention it deserves and which was formerly possible and necessary. The management of school affairs, except possibly certain community and civic interests, should be in the hands of a county board of about five members whose business it should be to establish schools, erect buildings, employ teachers, secure necessary supplies, etc.

"The little school district employing one teacher and managed by a local board did very well in pioneer days, but as an administrative unit for school purposes it has outlived its usefulness. Recent consolidation of schools in many parts of our county is only an indication of the increasing demand for a more effective school organization.

"The teacher situation looks more favorable than it did a few months ago. Nearly all schools are now supplied with teachers. Salaries have been increased about 50 per cent over those for last year. As a result competent teachers are being attracted. Considerable interest is being shown in an effort to bring our schools up to a higher standard, and taking all into consideration, prospects seem bright for a very successful year."

"The reason is that Oregon already has a legally constituted socialist party and for a new party to choose a conflicting title would be contrary to law. Petitions for the new party, containing 8688 signatures have been presented to the secretary of state by T. F. Johns, but were held back pending an opinion from the attorney general. The number of signatures is more than the required 5 per cent of the total vote cast at the last general election, but another name must be selected. It was said by Mr. Johns that if the name "Socialist-Labor" should be held conflicting with the "socialist party," the name chosen might be "industrial-labor" party. As soon as a title is decided upon the party can call a convention, nominate candidates, certify them to the secretary of state, and they will go upon the ballot.

Seek to Prove Grandad Lynched (By United Press) BUTTE, Mont.—While most folks whose ancestors within six or eight generations were brigands are exceedingly anxious to cover the fact, Mr. and Mrs. Geo. A. Adams of Cincinnati, O., would be more than pleased could they establish beyond a doubt that Adams' paternal grandfather ended a career as a bandit in the early Montana days by "stretching hemp" for the amusement and satisfaction of a band of vigilantes. In fact, it would please them just about \$500,000 worth.

It happens this way: George A. Adams, the grandfather, lured by the tales of gold discoveries in the west, left his wife and children in Chicago, and came to Montana in 1861. Nothing was heard of him for several years and then a rumor reached Cincinnati, to which place the wife and children had moved, that Adams had been convicted of murder and lynched.

When Adams left Chicago, in addition to his family, he left behind him property, to-wit, one lot valued then at about \$50. Since 1861, however, the value of the lot has increased to \$500,000, but lacking clear proof that Grandfather Adams is actually dead, clear title to the property cannot be secured by George A. Adams, the grandson.

In an effort to establish the fact his grandfather died at the end of a hempen rope pulled by vigilantes in Montana, Adams is now in Butte interviewing old-timers who were members of the vigilantes. To date his search for proof has proved fruitless, for while some of the pioneers can vividly recall lynching bees aplenty in the sixties, no one can remember a lynching bee principal named Adams. It is thought that Grandfather Adams, if he actually was hanged for banditry, died under an assumed name.

PONZI STILL KICKING THROUGH

BOSTON—The run on the Securities Exchange company, headed by Charles Ponzi, dwindled noticeably today. Perhaps 100 note holders were on hand to present their claims, but the long line that has heretofore extended along the street for a block or more, was missing. Speculators were again in evidence seeking to buy notes.
