PROSSER, Wash. — Plunging into the swift current of the Yakima river 200 yards below Prosser falls without removing her clothing, 15-year-old Edna Ward of this city rescued Miss Edith Rose, who was sinking for the third time. While swimming with a party of girl friends, Miss Rose was drawn by an under current into the swirling rapids. Two of the companions, both expert swimmers, attempted to rescue her, and both were nearly drowned in turn when Miss Ward, who saw the struggle from shore dove into the stream and assisted in bringing Miss Rose to shore. After considerable work Dr. W. W. Brand restored her to consciousness.

## Car Shortage Is Relieved

PORTLAND.—Decided improvement in the supply of empty cars coming to this region has been noted the past few days, according to railway traffic officials. The Spokane, Portland and Seattle system, which receives most of its equipment from the Great Northern and Northern Pacific, is beginning to feel the effect of the movement of large numbers of empties through the Spokane gateway. Double the former average daily number of cars received at Huntington from the Oregon Short Line by the O.-W. R. R. & N. now move westward for loading and return eastward on the Union Pacific system. The Southern Pacific is reported to be making good on its assurance that at least 100 empty cars daily would be kept moving northward through Ashland. Although deliveries of cars for loading seems to have been speeded up in this district, the demand for cars is as strong as ever, traffic men say.
