Commissioner Drake Resigns

PORTLAND, Oct. 4.—The resignation of Frederick Drake as United States commissioner for this district has been accepted by Federal Judges Wolverton and Bean. Kenneth F. Frazer, deputy clerk in federal district court, has been appointed to succeed him in the commission.

Mr. Drake has occupied the commissioner's bench since 1912, covering two terms of four years and a part of a third term. He gave no reasons for his resignation.

WEST VIRGINIA LEADS MARYLAND

WASHINGTON, — West Virginia, with a population of 1,463,610, an increase of 242,491 or 19.9 per cent over 1910, has passed Maryland in the relative standing of the states. West Virginia stood twenty-seventh.

Wheeling, W. Va., (revised), 56,208; increase 14,567 or 35 per cent. Previously announced 54,322.

Mobile, Ala., (revised), 60,777; increase 9256 or 18 per cent. Previously announced 60,151.

Says Deer Hunters Should Wear Red

Denver, Colo., Oct. 4.—Flaming red hats may be worn by all hunters who enter the Colorado deer country this season; if the suggestion of George E. McDonald, prominent sportsman, is adopted.

The increased number of casualties among hunters each year caused by inexperienced and careless shooters has aroused sportsmen to the need for some protective measures to prevent the numerous "accidental" shootings during the deer-hunting season, and McDonald suggests that each hunter be compelled to wear a red hat or a red handkerchief around his neck to distinguish him plainly from game.

"Too many hunters blaze away at the first object they see," McDonald declared, "and some bright object that is plainly visible may be the means of saving several lives."
