Notice of City Budget For the Year of 1921

In compliance with the statute in such cases made and provided, notice to voters, taxpayers and all others interested is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, together with the City Recorder, Gertrude Biede, at a regular meeting held in the city hall on the 9th day of November, 1920, made estimates of the several amounts required to be raised by special taxation upon the assessed valuation of the property within the corporate limits of said city, to pay the annual running expenses of the said city for the ensuing year, and an itemized schedule of which is herein set out.

And notice is further given that on the 30th day of November, 1920, at the hour of 8 p. m., of said day, the City Council will meet at the City Hall, at which time and place said estimates may be discussed with the Council by the legal voters and taxpayers of the city, after which the Council will make the levies for said purposes for said year 1921.
