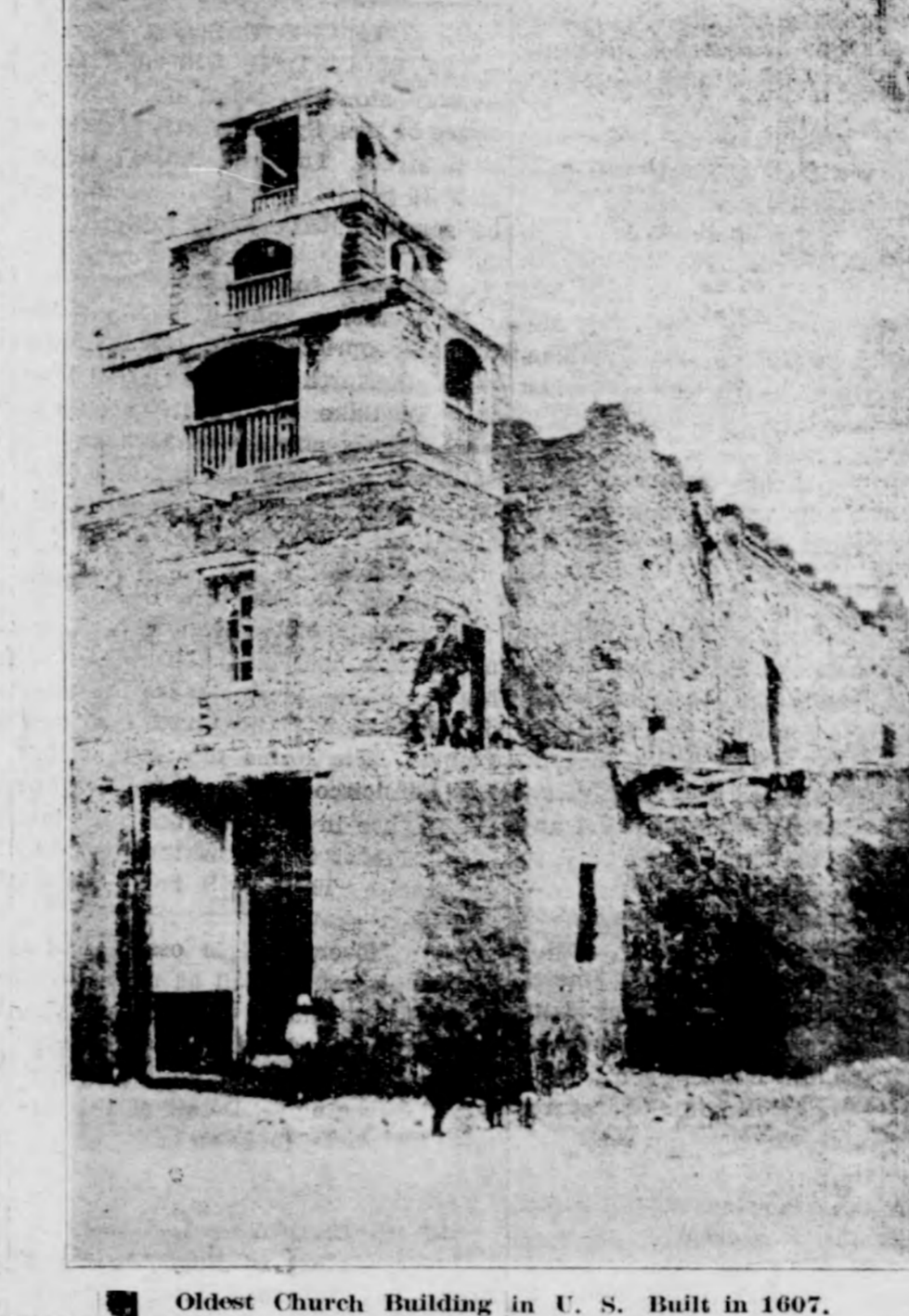


Chautauqua Worker Obtains Interesting Details of Southwest

To the Editor: Many times have I gone speeding through this section of the country on the limited trains of the Santa Fe system and always thought of it as a worthless, barren waste whose monotony was only broken by the crazy peaks and scarred ravines of the Rocky mountains, but I suppose it's a good thing that we never get too old to learn. I have always prided myself that notwithstanding all my faults and failures I had, at least, some knowledge of the country in which we live, but having spent more than one month leisurely traveling through New Mexico and Arizona, I have come to the conclusion that my knowledge of this part of the nation was sadly lacking for it is here that traces of our most ancient civilization is found.

One may travel in almost any direction from Santa Fe and find the ruins of old communal houses now almost completely buried and in some instances entirely so. Some of these houses or community dwellings have been found to contain more than one thousand rooms. Throughout Northern Arizona and New Mexico the archaeologist is busy with his spade constantly digging up something new out of the buried part of this wonderland. In addition to that which we know nothing about except as it is dug up out of the ground here, there are many things of interest that are ancient and still within the events of our recorded history. Santa Fe has within her city limits and facing the public square the oldest government building in the United States: It is known as the "Palace of Governors." It has been occupied by a succession of nearly one hundred governors—Spanish, Pueblo, Mexican and American, beginning prior to 1620, and ending with Gov. George Curry in 1909. One of the most famous governors New Mexico ever had was Gen. Lew Wallace. It was here he finished that wonderful book, "Ben Hur." He wrote the fifth, sixth and seventh chapters of that famous story in one of the quiet back rooms of this historic building which is now known as the Lew Wallace room. This building is now used as a state museum and is carefully kept in a fairly good state of repair.

Santa Fe claims the honor of having the oldest house now being occupied by a family in America. Any man walking up and down these streets and observing these buildings or most of them at least would need no argument to convince him that no buildings anywhere could be older and still stand up. One of the most historic places of Santa Fe is the old San Miguel church which was built in 1607; was partly destroyed during the Pueblo revolution in 1680, and repaired in 1710. Inside the old church is a bell which they claim was made in Spain one hundred years before Columbus discovered America. I was at a loss here to enter into an argument on account of the facts in question dating back prior to my recollection. I did concede however, that both the bell
