end of the period with another, and so on. Mr. Fish has already started a relay of New York Legion members in his office.

An appeal has been made to National Headquarters of the American Legion by officers of the American and French Children's League to aid the League in its distribution of several millions of poppies, which the women of France have made to be worn on Memorial day. The poppies will be sold in all parts of the United States and the proceeds will be used for French and American war orphans.

The fact that a veteran who gets into trouble with the law is an ex-service man will not be emphasized by the Associated Press, according to orders issued to its superintendents and correspondents. The American Legion at its second annual convention passed a resolution urging the press to adopt a similar policy.

American Legion members were chosen for office at two California special elections in one week. Walter F. Linberger, past commander of Long Beach Post No. 27, was elected to congress, and Walter C. Smith of Golden Gate Post No. 40, to the state legislature. Two Legion men now represent California in congress and fifteen ex-service men have seats in the state legislature.

Enlisting new members is not difficult for Medford Post No. 7 of the American Legion, which received a prize flag as the most efficient Oklahoma post in a state membership campaign. With a membership of fifteen last September, the post obtained renewals from every member and added fifty-four names to its rolls. Wilken Green Post No. 190, of Gotebo, would have received the prize, had its report been made on time. The Gotebo post renewed its fourteen members and gained seventy-six recruits.

Every American Legion post in Kings County, N. Y., has adopted a ward in Fox Hills hospital, Staten Island, N. Y., which shelters more than one thousand disabled veterans of the world war. The Legion members have established a regular schedule of visits, entertainments and gift parties as well as a system of assistance in obtaining compensation and other rights of their comrades.

Billy Marvin, an ex-service man, of Mulberry, Kan., found real help in the Fred Hutchison Post of the American Legion at Mulberry, and the Ben Fuller Post, of Pittsburg, Kan. While a member of the 106th Infantry, Marvin suffered disability which necessitated his removal to Arizona. The Mulberry post staged a benefit dance, the entire proceeds being given to Marvin, and the Ben Fuller post also aided him financially.

A meeting of Aarvig-Campbell Post No. 78, of Pontiac, Ill., was the scene of the presentation of the Distinguished Service Cross to Sergeant Isadore Solomon, of that city, who was cited for extraordinary heroism in recovering an airplane message in front of the line near Sammanthe, France, November 4, 1918, in the face of heavy machine gun fire.

PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE OPENS SOLDIER HOSPITALS

In the last six weeks nine hospitals for soldier patients have been opened by the U. S. Public Health service. Of these, four are fine buildings that have been leased from their owners. The others are army hospitals, built hurriedly during the war, that have been taken over and put into as good condition as possible. The demands on the service for accommodation are too great to permit even these flimsy wooden war structures to be refused.
