MAKING COACHES AT SUMMER SCHOOL. BLOOMINGTON, Ind., June 2.—Future Pop Warners and Percy Houghtons will be molded at the Indiana University school for coaches here this summer. Each year the school is held for high school or college teachers who wish to give their students the benefits of specialized coaching. Nearly 400 were enrolled in the school last summer. Regular university credits are given students taking the courses in baseball, football, basketball, track, wrestling, tennis, golf, swimming and other sports. Seventeen physical education courses will be given this year. Most of them are open to both men and women. A course in the theory and practice of basketball and baseball is included in the courses for women.
