





And Australia

DECLARES NEARLY HALF OF SCHOOL CHILDREN BEHIND

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COL-LEGE, Corvallis, June 20-Nearly half of the children in the grade schools-41 out of every 100 to be exact-are a grade behind where they should be, considering their age said Dr. B. W. DeBusk, professor of education at the University of Oregon who lectured here on the question of child delinquency. They are in the large majority, children who are handicapped by conditions of health. many of them having tonsilitis, adenoids or some kindred ailment.

An examination on subjects regarded as absolutely essential for the next higher grade was given to a class in an Oregon school, pointed out Dr. DeBusk. The students who passed with an extra high standard were separated from the rest of the class, placed in a coaching room for a period, given intensive training and passed over the next grade into



the second above.

"There are 5000 mental defective in the state," said Dr. DeBusk, "and something must be done to cut this number down. They are a source of expense to the state and intelligently training and help will undoubtedly be the best thing for them."
