ing with nerves. We expect to win just as soon as possible," Jack Kearns, manager of the champion said. "Carpenter is fit and ready to fight the greatest battle of his life."

We have the greatest confidence. The fight will not last long," Francois Descamps, manager of the Frenchman said.

Weights of the two principals were not announced this morning but it was expected that the champion would weigh around 190 pounds with the challenger around 175 pounds. The champion, who moved up to a
