

Peanut Flour Valuable. Various investigators have demonstrated that bread made from wheat flour of current composition is inadequate as the only source of protein in the diet. Government workers have found, however, that bread made with a mixture of 25 parts of peanut flour and 75 parts of wheat flour furnished adequate proteins for normal growth of experimental animals. Big Cattle Ranches No More. The day of the big cattle ranches has gone and the tendency is now in the direction of smaller herds. The average size of the present herd is 700 head, whereas in former times it was many thousands. At the same time the quality of the cattle is improving and the animals bring greater prices. The compulsory erection of fences has had something to do with this new condition for it is now a difficult matter to move a herd around in search of good grazing grounds, as was the custom some years ago.
