Sun's Glow Changes in Shape.
The Gegenschein, the mysterious midnight glow in the sky opposite the sun, is not constant in form. Prof. E. E. Barnard finds that in early autumn it appears as a roundish diffused mass of noticeable light, sometimes 40 degrees or 50 degrees or even more in diameter. At no other point in its path is it so large. But in October it becomes smaller and elongated, a change believed to be due to the mingling of its light with that of an auroral band reaching it at this season of the year.

Peanut Flour Valuable.
Various investigators have demonstrated that bread made from wheat flour of current composition is inadequate as the only source of protein in the diet. Government workers have found, however, that bread made with a mixture of 25 parts of peanut flour and 75 parts of wheat flour furnished adequate proteins for normal growth of experimental animals. The proteins of the peanut bread were utilized for gain almost twice as well as those contained in wheat bread. This does not mean that the familiar staff of life should be abandoned or regularly diluted with peanut flour; it does, however, put a stamp of real nutritive merit on a food product that many a physician still thinks of solely in terms of a trouble maker for digestion.

"Player-Typewriter."
Promising for office use is the new "automatic typewriter," which furnishes its own dictation, being operated on the same principle as a player piano, an exchange states.

Rolls of perforated paper, similar to the music rolls used on player-pianos govern the movements of the type keys. All that is necessary is to adjust one of these rolls in the machine and the writing "does itself." By this means perfectly written "form letters" are produced, with space left for signature; or the same method may be employed for turning out any other matter previously prepared in the shape of a perforated roll.

Big Cattle Ranches No More.
The day of the big cattle ranches has gone and the tendency is now in the direction of smaller herds. The average size of the present herd is 700 head, whereas in former times it was many thousands. At the same time the quality of the cattle is improving and the animals bring greater prices. The compulsory erection of fences has had something to do with this new condition, for it is now a difficult matter to move a herd around in search of good grazing grounds, as was the custom some years ago.

"Poison Gas" Pistol.
Poison gas, as developed for military purposes, is the ammunition used in a tiny pistol now carried by many persons in Paris as a protection against highwayman. The liquid source of the gas is contained in the handle of the gun, and compressed air for its ejection is supplied by a bicycle pump through a valve in the bottom.

Evelyn Pass.
In the great government reserve on the eastern side of Yellowstone pass in the Rocky mountains, known as Jasper park, Alberta, is a pass leading from Athabaska falls, on the Athabaska river, to Maligne lake. The geographic board of Canada has recently named the pass Evelyn, after Evelyn, duchess of Devonshire, wife of his excellency the governor general, and daughter of the marquis of Lansdowne, who was governor general of Canada from 1883 to 1888. The duchess of Devonshire visited the pass, now named after her, during last summer.—Montreal Family Herald.
