FORESTERS ARE APPOINTED AS HEALTH OFFICERS

PORTLAND, Or., July 12.—By an agreement just signed by District Forester George H. Cecil and Frederick D. Stricker, state health officer of Oregon, the forest supervisors in the state of Oregon have been appointed as deputy state officers.

This agreement applies only to the forest supervisors who are the officers in charge of the national forests, of which there are fourteen in Oregon. The above agreement does not apply to the forest rangers or other field officers. The forest supervisors will co-operate with the Oregon state health board in enforcing the sanitation laws of the state within the national forests, and will serve without pay. The duties of the forest supervisors under this agreement are to report insanitary conditions and violations of the Oregon health laws occurring within the national forests; to advise violators of what the state health laws are, and if such violations are continued, to report such conditions to the state health officer.

The forest officials under existing federal rules are required to protect and keep pure so far as they are able the domestic water supplies of towns, cities and camping places, and to prevent the accumulation of filth and insanitary practices in the forests that may be injurious to the public using the national forest areas.

With the greatly increasing use being made of national forests by the public for recreation, forest officers state that the necessity of enforcement of the federal and state sanitation rules becomes imperative, for there are still careless campers who do not comply with the rules.
