Charles Sperry of the United States piological department, has returned to Seattle, after collecting over 150 specimens of bird and small animal life in Southern Oregon, largely in Jackson county. Every species of frog and lizard that inhabits this section were secured. All but thirtyfour specimens of so-called low life n this section were secured. 
