WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 6 .-If investigations show that parcel post rates caused the deficit of \$70,-000,000 in postal revenue, Postmaster General Hays told the Unit ed Press today that parcel post rates must be increased. Hays said the business of the postoffice department had fallen off since April, and that the parcel post should be self-supporting. A rigid system of economy is being instituted.
