Highway Commission Reports on Jackson Co. Road Work

(Continued From Yesterday.)
Gold Hill-Josephine County Line Paving

Contract No. 116, for the paving of this section of the Pacific highway, was awarded on May 6, 1919, to S. S. Schell & J. L. Calvert, Grants Pass, Oregon. This work is 12.2 miles in length and follows the Rogue river from Gold Hill to the Josephine county line.

The original contract called for a 2-inch bitulithic pavement on a crushed rock, or a crushed gravel base. This was later changed to an inch-and-a-half to three-inch bituminous base, the thickness varying, depending on the conditions of the subgrade.

One of the contractor's paving plants proved to be unsuited for this work after it had been brought on the ground, and could not be used. The quarry first opened produced an excellent rock in the beginning, but as the quarrying progressed the material became so soft that this quarry had to be abandoned. Gravel from Fooths creek was then used, but this had to be washed before it could be used as paving material, and after a washer had been installed, Fooths creek went dry owing to an unusual drought. Due to these adverse conditions this work has been delayed and will not be completed until next year.

Roy Nunn is resident engineer on the work, for which the total estimated final cost is \$410,000. The entire project is to be paid for from state funds, the expenditures to date being \$191,181.07.

Central Point-Gold Hill Paving
 On April 15, 1919, contract No. 100 was awarded to the Clark & Heneery Construction company, of Stockton, Calif., for laying 8.9 miles of pavement between Central Point and Gold Hill on the Pacific highway. This pavement was a two-inch bitulithic and was laid on a three-inch bituminous base. The bituminous base was laid upon the ground except in a few places where crushed gravel was rolled in before the base was placed. In addition to the three-legged roller, a tandem roller was used to iron out the top, which gave an exceptionally smooth, even surface. This pavement has been laid over a year and not a single break has occurred as yet.

The building of the fills, or approaches to the Tolo overcrossing was included in this contract, and the charges later transferred to the structure construction. These fills were allowed to settle during the winter of 1919-1920, and in the following spring these fills and the overcrossing were paved. Work was started May 15, 1919, and completed December 20, 1919, except for the work at the Tolo overcrossing. The entire section was completed July 20, 1920, the final cost of this project being \$223,062.72, which was

all paid from state funds. Roy Nunn was resident engineer in charge of the work.

Ashland Hill Paving
 This work was completed at date of this report, with expenditures of \$15,908.93 having been made. During the present biennium, dealed charges have been paid to the extent of \$432.22, bringing the total cost of the work to the state to \$16,346.25.

Germany Agrees To Payment For Lusitania, Claim

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 30.—Thomas W. Miller, alien property custodian, declared today that under the terms of the new German-American treaty, Germany agrees to pay for the American lives lost on the Lusitania and satisfy all other claims caused by the ex-kaiser's government. Germany must take such action before the property formerly owned by German interests in the United States and now held by this government, will be returned to its owners.

KENNEDY CASE AT LOS ANGELES PLEAD NOT-GUILTY
 LOS ANGELES, Calif., Aug. 30.—Madalyun Obenchain and Arthur Burch, held in connection with the recent murder of Belton Kennedy, pleaded not guilty today to a charge of murdering the man.
 Burch was composed and made his plea in a firm voice. Mrs. Obenchain was visibly affected and just managed to whisper the words. Ralph Obenchain, her divorced husband, was at her side during the proceedings. The trial is set for November 1.

EUROPE'S GOLD RESERVES
 While Europe sent to the United States more than \$250,000,000 in gold during the first six months of the current year above receipts from this country, nevertheless, a slight gain occurred in that period in the total gold reserves of Europe held by central banks or government agents.
 Only three of the fourteen chief European gold holding countries showed a diminution in their gold stocks from January 1 to July 1, and these losses were relatively slight, their combined total amounting to less than \$12,000,000. This loss was more than offset by gains among the other eleven countries, the net increase of the fourteen combined amounting to \$1,199,000.

Yet between January 1 and July 1, the gold stock held by the United States increased by \$402,601,000, or nearly 20 per cent. of the \$2,059,330,000 they held the first of the year, almost two-thirds of the increase being made up by the gold from European shipping points, the rest coming from non-European and domestic sources.
 An analysis of this gold movement shows that present European gold reserves are not being drained to swell America's holdings, but that the increments to this country's hoard since the first of the year, in so far as shipments from European points are concerned, are chiefly accounted for by three great streams

of the metal consisting of newly mined supplies from Africa, coming by way of London; of gold yielded up by India, also coming by London; and of metal thought to have originated from Russian sources, eventually coming to America through various European countries.

While these reserves have been, by continued government impoundage, kept rigidly stabilized at the points attained as a result of those extraordinary war and postwar measures, in the face of the recent tremendous suction toward America, nevertheless the three great streams have flowed through

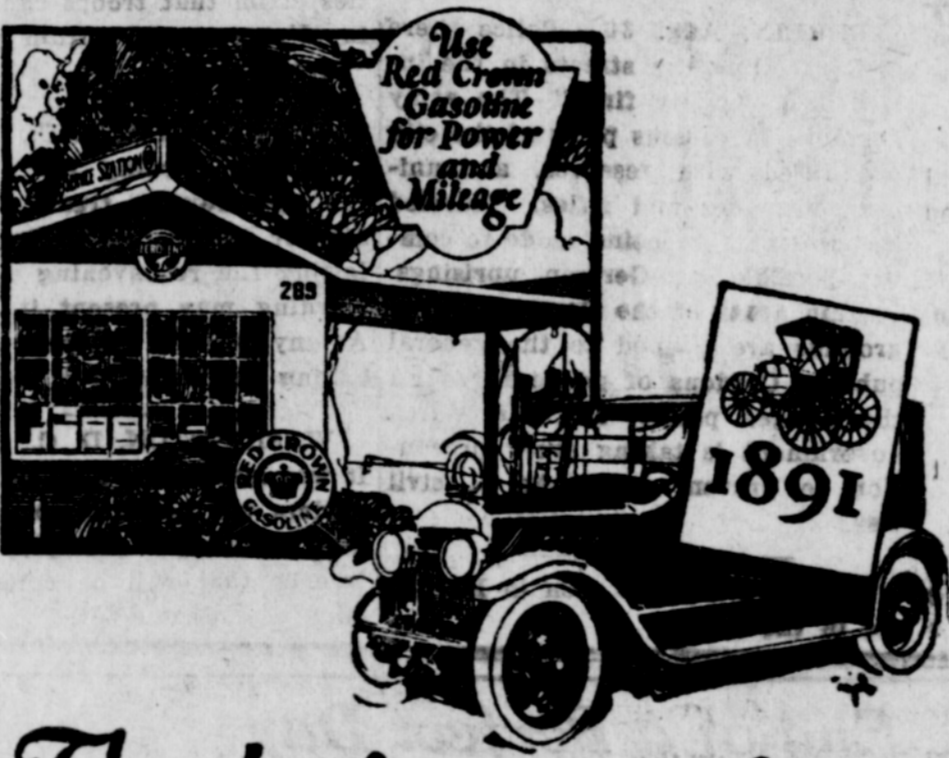
