Local Boys Given Sergeants Rank at Camp Perry, O.

The Oregon State Rifle team, of which James Q. Adams and A. J. McCallen of this city, are members, is enjoying its outing at the national shooting meet being held at Camp Perry, Ohio, in spite of a stiff program of military training, according to a letter received from Guardsman McCallen by Captain Briggs.

Excerpts from his letter follows: "The Oregon team bids fair to shoot from twentieth to twenty-fifth place, as against fifty-fifth last year. All last week was devoted entirely to instruction and practice shooting. The matches of which there are some 35 or 40 commenced this morning and will continue till the 22nd. All members of the Oregon team are shooting within a few points of each other; no very marked difference in any of them. J. Q. is pretty well toward the top and I'm about in the middle as an average. The S. O. making us Sergeants came thru O. K. so now we are right up among the high brows. The team members generally are good fellows, so there is never any friction or hard feelings."

DEATH LIST GROWS

IN TEXAS DISASTER; ASHLAND PEOPLE SAFE

DALLAS, Tex., Sept. 12.—As wire communication is slowly being re-established after Friday night's tornado and cloudburst in south, central and southwest Texas, the loss of life and property damage grows. Seventy-eight bodies have been recovered, many other probably having been swept away in the flood. An area of 12,000 square miles has suffered great damage. The death list at San Antonio is now estimated at close to 100. Forty-five bodies have been recovered.

SINN FEIN AGREE TO PEACE CONFERENCE IN LATEST MESSAGE

DUBLIN, Sept. 12.—De Valera's reply to the British cabinet's note protests against any stipulations for a peace conference at Inverness, Scotland, and expresses a preference for a parley without the issue of a break from the British empire being raised, it was learned today. The Sinn Fein note, which accepts the British proposal for a peace conference, was dispatched today.
