RIOTS BREAK OUT IN WARSAW; TROOPS PATROL STREETS—FEAR CLASH

BERLIN, Sept. 20.—Troops are patrolling Warsaw to prevent political riots, according to a dispatch from Breslau this morning. Public buildings are under military guard and armored cars are held in readiness.

According to the dispatch, feeling is running high on the part of both the socialistic and conservative elements, and the Polish government is in fear of a clash that might lead to wholesale street fighting.
