Some of those who thought Mr. Harding would be putty in the presidency, are awakening to find that he is flint, when occasion requires.

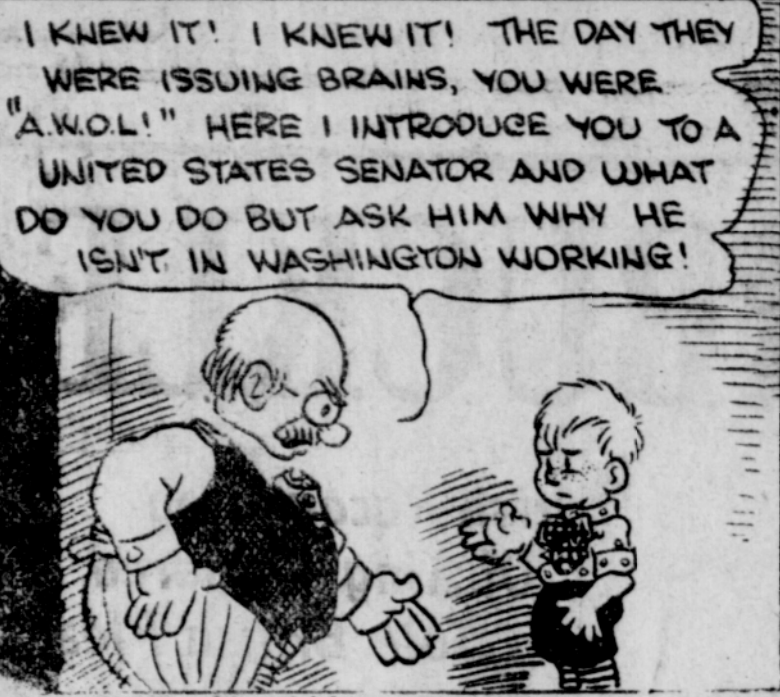

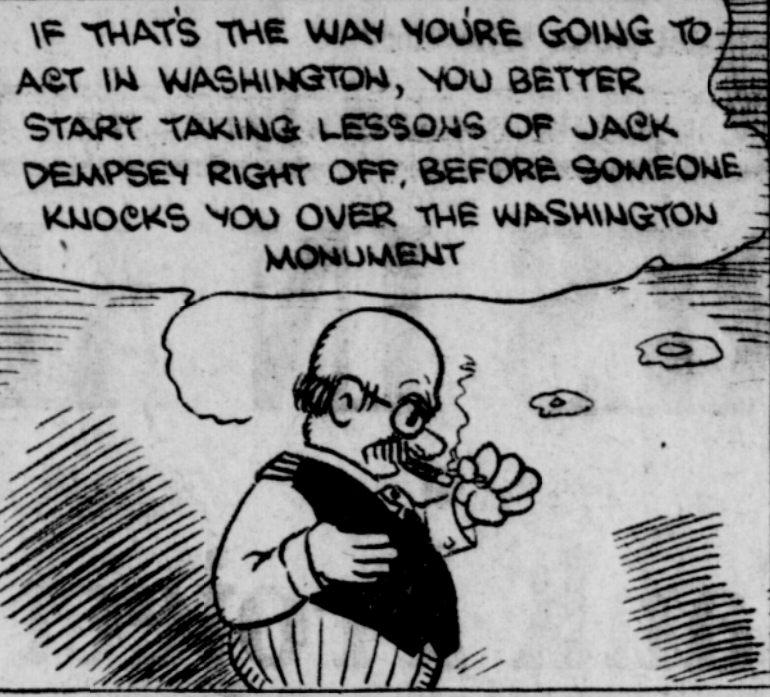

Having made a trip to Alaska and various parts of the country this summer I thought it might be interesting to hear of some of the places visited.

Leaving Portland on train 12 over the Union Pacific 7:30 p. m., we traveled along the Columbia river with its grand scenery, passing the Columbia highway with its myriads of automobiles, and towards dusk their lights showed up like fairy land.

Hand the broad Columbia with the lights of the steamers makes a sight not soon forgotten. As time wore on and we were soundly sleeping in our sleeper, only to be awakened by the porter calling us to get up for Spokane.

It seemed a dream from what we had just passed through. Here we transferred to another line, and as soon as baggage could be loaded and the hurry and bustle of transferring, we again got under way for Lethbridge, Alberta.

This line is very scenic passing through large wheat fields of the Inland Empire, passing Sand Point and Bonner's Ferry where one sees lake boating parties and general outdoor life.

Parties outfitting for pleasure trips in all directions, our next stop being King's Gate, where we go through the usual inspection of baggage by officials of both countries after unloading baggage from baggage cars and suit cases inspected they are again loaded into the baggage car.

Staying at Hotel Lethbridge for two days gave us quite a chance to see the place, coming into Lethbridge the railroad crosses a very high bridge, and was told was the highest trestle bridge now known and is 317 feet high and one mile long.
