3,000 HOBOKEN LONGSHOREMEN ARE ON STRIKE

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—This morning's strike of longshoremen, which started on the Hoboken waterfront this morning, has extended, despite the efforts of the International Longshoremen's association. It is estimated that nearly 12,000 men are out this afternoon. Officials of the association said the strike was unauthorized. The recalcitrants struck in protest against their wage and the hour terms of the new agreement made by the association with the steamship companies.

BERLIN, Oct. 1.—Forty thousand cooks and waiters struck here today. Foreign visitors are leaving owing to difficulty in getting meals.
