FIRE PREVENTION RULES

A few rules for preventing fires in homes or other buildings have been suggested to the public by the Boston fire department.

Never put hot ashes in wooden barrels and never hang clothing over a stove or stovepipe. Children should not start or go near bonfires without the presence of a responsible grown-up, and matches should be kept beyond their reach. No one should enter a clothes closet with a lighted match, candle or lamp. The use of gasoline, naphtha or benzine in a room with an open flame—either gas or stove—is taboo.

All fire escapes and stairways should be kept free from obstruction. All conditions liable to cause fire should be reported to the nearest fire station.

Every member of the family should know the location of the nearest fire alarm box and how to use it, and be able to manipulate handy fire extinguishers.

The list is old and familiar. Yet 15,000 lives were lost through fire in the United States in 1920. If you know the rules and practice them, then teach them to the rest of the family.

CROP OUTLOOK OPTIMISTIC

The department of agriculture announces that more than \$5,000,000,000 will go into the pockets of the farmers of the nation from crops raised during 1921 from cereal crops, cotton, potatoes and hay.

As itemized, the amounts are: Corn, \$1,790,462,312; wheat, \$761,

396,000; oats, \$327,084,600; barley, \$78,445,820; rye, \$73,338,480; potatoes, \$695,667,690; cotton, \$439,812,500, and hay, \$1,106,042,300, or a total of \$5,277,649,702.

Aside from this, the sugar crop comes in for honorable mention with a total this year of some 962,000 tons.

Wisconsin To Meet Competition By Coast Methods

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Oct. 15.—Wisconsin orchardists are planning to meet and overcome Pacific coast competition by adopting Pacific coast methods of culture and marketing fruit, according to a recent issue of the University of Wisconsin Press Bulletin. The new practice by which they hope to grow fruit as good as the coast product are chiefly pruning and spraying.

The growers are told by the university horticultural extension specialist that they can put their home-grown fruits back into the local markets by thinning out the wood to get better size and color, by spraying to keep away insects and diseases, and by picking the fruit so carefully as to avoid thumbprint bruises, by grading it properly and by holding in cold storage under moist conditions to prevent shriveling.

Reports from other mid-west and some eastern states go to show that orchardists are beginning to follow the Oregon plans of production and marketing.

"But this does not necessarily mean that the coast growers are going to lose the markets for their choice high-grade stuff," comes back W. W. Brown, chief of horticulture at the Oregon Agricultural college experiment station. "The eastern growers have not our climate that puts fine color into the fruit, and almost insures a fair crop every year."

COWGILL IS NAMED ENGINEER FOR MEDFORD IRRIGATION DISTRICT

MEDFORD, Or., Oct. 15.—Ralph Cowgill was appointed engineer for the Medford Irrigation district by the district directors and took up his duties yesterday.

Mr. Cowgill, who was engineer for the canal company several years ago, was among a number of men recommended by State Engineer Percy Cupper. The directors finally selected Mr. Cowgill because they felt he was on the ground, was thoroughly familiar with all the conditions, and therefore was in a better position to push the work at once than any outside engineer.

To the Editor: The condition of the Pacific highway between Roseburg and the California line as of this date is as follows:
 Roseburg-Myrtle Creek—Twenty miles; paved.
 Myrtle Creek-Canyonville — Ten miles. The bridge across the Umpqua is completed so that traffic can now use the main highway. Macadam is completed from Myrtle Creek to the Umpqua river, a distance of six miles, and the remaining three miles to Canyonville is being macadamized. The road over this stretch is fair.
 Canyonville - Galesville — Eleven miles; good macadam.
 Galesville-Wolf Creek—Fourteen miles. Paving in progress from both ends, ten miles already being completed. About seven miles south of Galesville between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., south-bound traffic is detoured over the old road via Glendale and over the Tunnel road to Wolf Creek. This detour is in good condition to Glendale. The Tunnel road detour is

narrow and steep, but will be used for one-way traffic only. All north-bound traffic will use the main highway at all hours. Short delays may be necessary between Stage Road pass and Cow Creek, where construction is in progress.

Wolf Creek-Grave Creek — Five miles; paved.
 Grave Creek-Pleasant Valley — Eight miles; good macadam.

Pleasant Valley-Grants Pass—Ten miles. Paving operations have started about two miles north of Grants Pass, one mile being already completed. Short detours are provided around most of this work. Where detours are not available, traffic is allowed to pass through with but short delays.

Grants Pass-Through Medford-Ashland-California Line—Sixty-five miles; paved.
 Medford-Crater Lake Highway
 Two routes are being used—one via Central Point, Hybee Bridge, Trail and McLeod to Prospect; the other via Eagle Point, Reese Creek school house, Derby to McLeod and Prospect. The new grade is opened for about six miles. Crater Lake lodge closed for the season October 1.

Y. M. C. A. Give Plans For Conference Here Next Week

The third annual Y. M. C. A. conference for older boys of southern Oregon will be held in Ashland October 21, 22 and 23.
