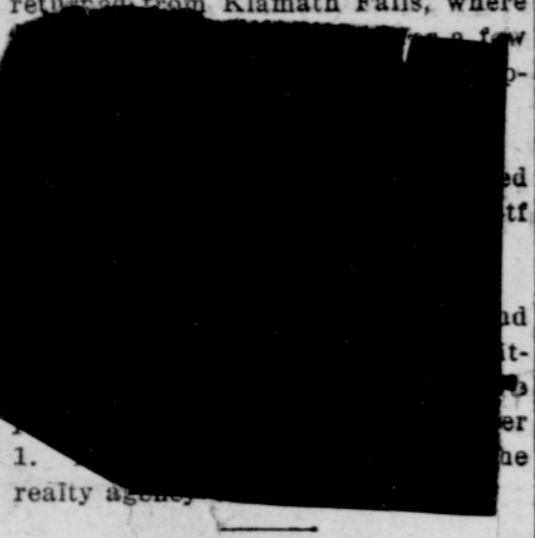
**Relay Letter Box Placed—**

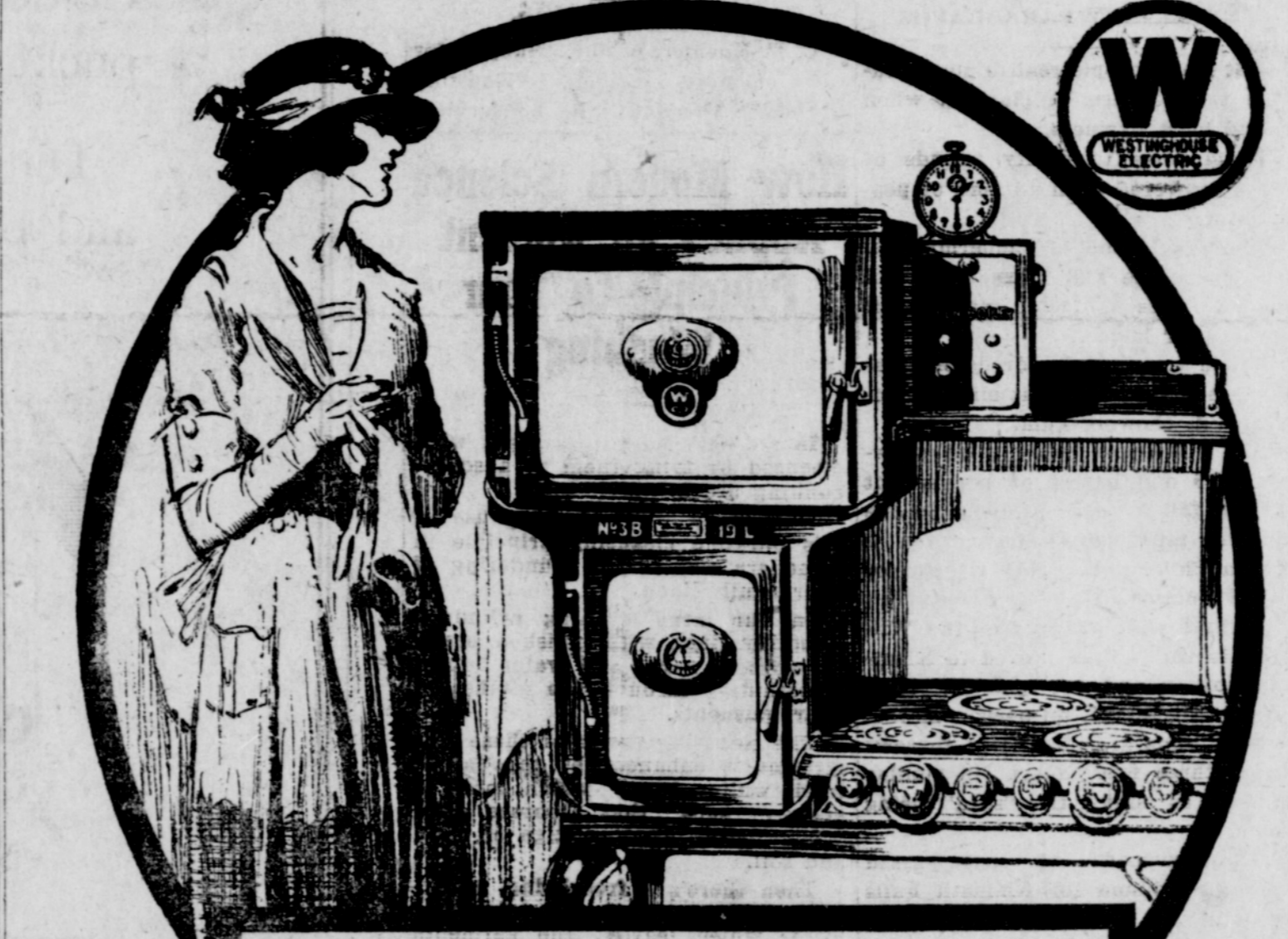
